On Wednesday evening, the Community and Economic Development (CED) Department, with assistance from the Engineering Division of the Public Works Department, hosted a public meeting at Bow Lake Elementary School. This was the third public outreach event in the [SeaTac 2035 Project](#), the City's process to update the Comprehensive Plan.

For this meeting, special effort was made to reach out to non-English-speaking populations. The meeting was attended by approximately 40 community members, including people from some of the City's ethnic populations. Interpreters for Spanish, Somali, Amharic and Tigrinya speakers helped community members participate in the discussions. The meeting format included food and childcare, which made it possible for many families to attend an evening meeting that they otherwise wouldn't be able to participate in.

City staff received valuable input from this meeting, which will help to inform policies as we move forward with the Comprehensive Plan update.

Citizen Advisory Committee Vacancies

The City has an immediate vacancy on the Senior Citizen and the Human Services Advisory Committees for alternate members. These committees serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council, assisting in decision-making and the setting of City policies.

The Senior Citizen Advisory Committee's mission is to work with the Staff Liaison to identify issues related to Senior Citizens in the community; act as an advisory body to the City Council and provide input through the City Manager and the Staff Liaison to the City Council on issues relating to Senior Citizens in the community; provide increased opportunities for community involvement by Senior Citizens of the City and community, in general; advise the City Council, through the City Manager and the Staff Liaison regarding the delivery of Senior Citizen programs and provide outreach to the community in an effort to develop and place Senior Citizen issues before the citizens of the City of SeaTac in a positive manner. Meetings are held on the third Tuesday of the month at SeaTac Community Center at 9:00 AM.

The Human Services Advisory Committee shall make reports and recommendations to the City Council concerning human services issues, including the following: review and recommend human services needs assessments and updates; develop recommendations for the City Council on priorities of needs within the community; review and recommend human services plans and policies, including the human services element of the City's comprehensive plan; evaluate funding requests and make recommendations; evaluate and review the performance of individual human services organizations; participate in collaborative planning efforts involving citizen groups, human services agencies, and local organizations which contribute to enhanced regional coordination; review City actions which may affect the accessibility or quality of human services available to the City's residents; and conduct other human services research, review and advocacy as requested by the City Council in response to emerging human services issues. Meetings are held the third Monday of the month at 5:30 PM at SeaTac City Hall.

All positions are appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the Council. Applications will be accepted until Friday, December 26.
