

Tree Board ~ Meeting Minutes ~

Call to Order: Meeting was called to order at 10:08 a.m.

Approval of Minutes: Minutes dated October 29, 2012 were approved as written. One clarification was that it is now the Planning Division of the Community and Economic Development Department.

Old Business:

- Tree planting of smaller caliper trees for future development. It was determined that this
 would remain a placeholder until we determine what other cities do and rationally compare
 nursery grown costs compared to moving established trees.
- Future grant application opportunities, tree inventory. Agreed to leave this as a placeholder as well and continue to look for creative ways of funding future inventories.
- Start application process for KCD (King Conservation District) dollars for 2013. Roger gave an update on the details for this grant opportunity.
- Planning Division involvement on this Board. Change future references to reflect that it will be Planning Division of CED (Community & Economic Development Department).
- Labor grant availability for removal of invasive plants in the urban forest. Roger reported that this opportunity had caveats attached that included development of an ongoing maintenance plan that we were unable to commit to.
- Tree Board Annual Report to City Council. This was completed at the first December City Council meeting.

New Business:

- Ideas for 2013 Arbor Day event. Ideas were discussed at length.
- Tree planting areas or projects. McMicken Heights Park and RC car track were mentioned as possible areas.

- McMicken Heights Park Tyee student project. Came to a consensus that this project is a
 good choice. Discussed event details and agreed to assign a date for a mid week event. Will
 begin to promote the event once the date is set. Discussed ideas for handouts giveaways, etc.
 We will exchange information via e-mail for date of event and future ideas.
- Tree City application and growth award status. Roger reported that DNR (Department of Natural Resources) had stated all looks good for both Tree City certification and our 2nd annual growth award.
- Audubon Society Ivy removal project at North SeaTac Park. This event is for invasive plant removals in North SeaTac Park south. Councilmember Fernald asked to be included in the project.
