City Hall and City facilities will be closed on Thursday, January 1 for New Year's Day.


Recology CleanScapes Holiday Collection Schedule

Holidays and winter weather may impact your garbage, recycling, and food & yard waste collection schedule.

Garbage, recycling and food & yard waste collection customers served by Recology CleanScapes may experience a change in collection days during the upcoming holiday season. Recology CleanScapes operates regularly on all holidays except for Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. If your collection day falls on or after Christmas Day or New Year's Day, your collection will be one day later that week.

For example: if your regularly scheduled collection day falls on New Year's Day (1/1/15), your carts will be collected on Friday, the day after New Year's (1/2). If your regularly scheduled collection day is Friday, during the week of New Year's you will be collected on Saturday.

Winter storms may make it unsafe to collect your containers. Please visit recologycleanscapes.com/seatac for service updates. Remember, if your service schedule is disrupted, we



will collect your containers as soon as it is safe to do so.

The intersection of 28th Avenue S. and S. 192nd Street in SeaTac will be closed from Monday, December 29 at 7:00 AM through Wednesday, December 31 at Noon.

Sound Transit's contractor, PCL Civil Constructors, will lift precast segments to build the light rail guideway over S. 192nd Street. No east/west traffic will be permitted through the intersection. Detour signs will be posted to get motorists and pedestrians safely around the construction work zone.
