

Airport Open House on Development Plans March 4

The Port of Seattle is holding a series of open houses to discuss the Sustainable Airport Master Plan (SAMP) which will develop a long-term blueprint for the future development of Sea-Tac Airport.

Federal Way Link Extension

Sound Transit is planning to extend light rail from the future Angle Lake Station (opening in 2016) at S. 200th Street in SeaTac to the Kent/Des Moines area by 2023. The project also develops a shovel-ready plan for extending light rail to the vicinity of the Federal Way Transit Center when additional funding is secured. For the past few months, Sound Transit staff has been meeting with affected property owners about the potential impacts of the alternatives and will continue our outreach efforts until Sound Transit's Board identifies a preferred alternative in summer 2015.

Spring – release of Draft Environmental Impact Statement; 45-day public comment begins
Spring – public hearings in Federal Way and Des Moines (details to be provided in March)
Summer – Sound Transit's Board identifies a preferred alternative and station options

Recology Store Opens in Highline Location

Recology CleanScapes officially opened a new recycling focused retail store and customer service center in the Five Corners Shopping Center in Burien. The new store serves Recology CleanScapes customers in the communities of Burien, Des Moines and SeaTac, and offers



opportunities for face-to-face customer service, the ability to drop-off hard to recycle items, and offers creative products and gifts designed to reduce waste while encouraging recycling. The products the store will sell are designed to be durable, reusable and kept out of landfills. Many products have been “up-cycled”, which turns something of lesser value into a higher use. Additionally, customers can use the location as a resource to drop-off hard to dispose of items like CFL light bulbs, household batteries, small electronics and appliances, used cooking oil, block Styrofoam™, and bicycles. Recology CleanScapes works with local non-profits to recycle, re-purpose or up-cycle items. The Recology Store is staffed by a team of recycling experts who are available to provide in-person customer service support for their Burien, Des Moines, and SeaTac customers. Their team can help answer any questions residents may have regarding their collection service such as bill payment, account changes, and how to save money by reducing waste. Additionally staff will be available to answer environmental stewardship questions such as identifying the correct cart to place materials in, and kitchen and back-yard composting.

SeaTac contracts with Recology CleanScapes to provide garbage, recycling and compostable hauling services to all residents and businesses. Community Police Academy

When disaster calls – how will you respond?

The City of SeaTac, Burien & Kent RFA are offering the FEMA-sponsored Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training at *no charge* starting April 16.

Following a large scale emergency, professional responders may not be immediately available as they are tasked with multiple priorities. Through CERT training, individuals and organizations learn life-saving response skills to help each other until professionals arrive.

CERT includes 21 hours of training, plus a simulated disaster drill. Topics include:

- Hazard Identification & Disaster Preparedness
- Incident Command Systems and Team Organization
- Fire Safety and Suppression
- Disaster Psychology and Emotional Impacts
- Light Search and Rescue
- Simple Triage
- Disaster Medical Operations
- Terrorism Awareness

Classes run each Thursday, 6:00 PM - 9:00 PM for seven weeks. The final drill and graduation are held on Saturday, May 30 from 9:00 AM - 1:00 PM. Participants must attend all classes and the drill in order to receive a certificate of completion.
