This award was presented Nurse Cheri Dreiling for her use of CPR to revive a three year old who was pulled unresponsive from the pool of the SeaTac Marriott Hotel on March 7, 2015.

Nurse Dreiling works for a Tacoma area hospital ICU and said that while she has done CPR many times in the hospital setting, this is the first time she's ever used her skills outside of work. This is also her first use of CPR on a child.

City Seeks Input on Stormwater Program Plan

The City of SeaTac has recently submitted its updated Stormwater Management Program (SWMP) Plan and Annual Report to the Washington State Department of Ecology. The updated plan and report serves the City in two ways: It maps out and confirms the City's compliance efforts with the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit; it also demonstrates the City's efforts to enhance our community by protecting our natural waterways.

The overall goal of the NPDES Permit is to reduce pollution carried by stormwater into lakes, streams, wetlands and the Puget Sound through effective stormwater management programs. This goal aligns directly with City Council's goal of "Enhancing our Community" to create a healthy, safe and attractive community. The City is working with local businesses, residents and non-profit groups in an effort meet these goals as efficiently as possible.

Please help us best meet the community's stormwater management needs by providing input on the recently published SWMP Plan, which describes our planned stormwater program activities for 2015. These activities include:

- Implementing new electronic forms to make storm drain inspection more efficient.
- Initiating process to update City development codes and standards to make Low Impact Development (stormwater infiltration) techniques the commonly use approach
- Maintaining ongoing programs like:
 - Stormwater inspections and maintenance
 - SeaTac's Spill Hotline 973.4770
 - · Public education and outreach
 - Field screening and investigating illicit discharges
