The Commission also studies and makes recommendations to the Council on a variety of development regulations. The Commission's goal is to maintain and achieve the highest level of the City's attributes so that all SeaTac citizens can enjoy and be proud to live in this community. Planning Commissioners are appointed by the Mayor and Council; the Commission consists of five members, each serving three year terms.

Planning Commission Meetings are held on the first and third Tuesday of each month at 5:30 PM at SeaTac City Hall.
