Washington's Most Wanted - Fraud Suspect Arrested

Recently KCPQ 13's "Washington's Most Wanted" news segment showcased a fraud investigation involving an asphalt paving scam that recently occurred in SeaTac. The broadcast included a suspect vehicle description and video of the male and female suspects. Two pieces of great news came from the story, generated by Detective Robin Fry:

First, within a few hours of the broadcast two local paving companies offered to pave the victim's driveway, free of charge. Arrangements are being made to facilitate that process.

Second, Fife Police Department arrested the male suspect who is now being guarded at St. Francis Hospital, apparently suffering a medical condition. He will eventually be booked into King County Jail pending fraud charges. He also has an outstanding warrant for fraud out of Utah.

National Night Out is an annual community-building campaign that promotes police-community partnerships and neighborhood camaraderie to make our neighborhoods safer, better places to live. Police, Fire and City officials will be visiting 16 neighborhood groups who will be gathering separately to celebrate this national crime prevention event.

Annual Ice Cream Social at Highline SeaTac Botanical Garden



King County's 2015 "Best Workplaces for Waste Prevention and Recycling" Awards

The King County Solid Waste Division and Executive Dow Constantine are honoring 112 Best Workplaces for Waste Prevention and Recycling this year, recognizing businesses and organizations that are going the extra mile to reduce waste and increase recycling.

The City of SeaTac is proud to announce that SeaTac businesses are among the 2015 award recipients: Alaska Airlines; The BBQ Schacht; LBA (Les Boulangers Associes) Bakery; Port of Seattle at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (honor roll); Windsor Heights Apartments; and the City of SeaTac (honor roll).



Last year, businesses in King County sent more than 200,000 tons of recyclable materials to the landfill. Businesses of all sizes are looking for ways to decrease this number. For example, Alaska Airlines joined the list for the first time in 2015. Alaska Airlines' In Flight team collected 2,200 tons of recyclables in 2014, keeping 77 percent of recyclables from Alaska Airlines and 94 percent of recyclables from Horizon Airlines out of the waste stream.

All businesses operating in King County outside the City of Seattle are eligible for the list. To qualify, businesses must meet five basic criteria, as well as 10 additional waste reduction and recycling criteria. - Make reports and recommendations on concerning human services issues
- Reviews City actions which may affect the accessibility or quality of human services available to the City's residents

The Hotel/Motel Tax Advisory Committee

- Meetings are held the second Wednesday of the month at 3:00 PM at SeaTac City Hall
- Members represent the lodging industry or associated tourism-related enterprise, including not-forprofit organizations
- Provides insight on the City Council annual budget development and adoption process

The Planning Commission

- Meetings are held the first and third Tuesday of the month at 5:30 PM at SeaTac City Hall
- Goal is to maintain and achieve the highest level of the City's attributes so that all SeaTac citizens can enjoy and be proud to live in this community
- Study and make recommendations to the City Council for adoption of long range comprehensive plans, policies, programs and services related to land use, transportation and community facilities

Police News

New Crime Prevention and Awareness Program - Walk Watch and Call

"Walk Watch and Call" is a crime prevention and community engagement program that is sponsored by the SeaTac Police Department and the National Association of Town Watch. It is designed as a fun way to encourage walkers to be aware of their surroundings, to report crime and to call police if they see suspicious activity. Compassionate Response by Officers to Domestic Violence

Last week a young mother fled with her four children to City Hall where she reported that she and her five year old son had been assaulted by her boyfriend. Officers Kevin Bugosh and Andy Conner investigated the crime. In addition to their normal investigation and report, they contacted DAWN (Domestic Abuse Women's Network) who arranged temporary housing for the family that was stranded with no money, food, phone or resources in this area. Once the family was settled in housing the deputies used their own money to buy groceries that would feed the family for a couple of days.

Death Investigation

On Monday, July 27 Police responded to an apartment complex after human remains were found in a duffle bag near a garbage dumpster. King County Sheriff's Office Homicide Detectives are investigating. The cause of death has not yet been determined. The victim has been identified as a 23 year old female; not a King County resident. There is no evidence to indicate that this was a random act or that the public should be alarmed. If anyone has information on the details about the above incident, they are urged to call the King County Sheriff's Office 24/7 at 296.3311.

Burglary Arrests by SeaTac Police

Thank you to the neighbors who reported suspicious activity!!

Early this month, Officers responded to the Windsor Heights Apartments when neighbors called to report a man breaking into one of the units. Officers caught the male suspect as he exited. The same man was suspected of a burglary attempt in SeaTac earlier the same day and two burglaries in Redmond earlier that week.

This week, Officers responded to an in-progress burglary in the 16600 block of 31st Avenue S. after an alert neighbor reported a break in. A male and female were taken into custody as they tried to flee on foot.



Quick Crime Update – Residential Burglaries

Residential Burglaries were down 52% in June, from May. This is below the 10-year average. The exact reason or the drop is unknown but it is most likely due to one or more prolific burglars being in custody.

In Progress Violence Training

July 20 & 27, Tyee Educational Complex

In an effort to ensure that SeaTac Police Officers remain prepared to respond to all types of inprogress violence (active shooter, single and multiple, etc), every officer received 10-hours of training over the last two weeks. SeaTac Police Officers worked through challenging scenarios to practice and test their skills. We appreciate the Highline School District for allowing us to conduct this training at Tyee Educational Complex.

Active Shooter Training

August 4 - 7, McMicken Elementary School

The SeaTac Police Department will be using grant funds to host a 4-day Active Shooter training session at McMicken Elementary School next week. This training will be attended by members of the SeaTac Police Department along with several other local police agencies. Neighbors of the school will see police vehicles outside – there is no cause for alarm. Again, we sincerely appreciate the support of the Highline School District as we seek to create realistic response scenarios for our officers.

Fourth of July Fireworks Recap

SeaTac Police responded to a total of 36 fireworks complaints on July 3, 4 & 5: four complaints on July 3; 15 complaints on July 4; 17 complaints on July 5. In total, nine pounds of fireworks were confiscated for destruction; many warnings were given; no citations were issued.


