# City of SeaTac Regular Council Meeting Minutes

September 22, 2015 6:30PM

**CALL TO ORDER:** The SeaTac City Council Regular Meeting was called to order by Mayor Mia Gregerson at 6:30 p.m.

**COUNCIL PRESENT:** Mayor Mia Gregerson, Deputy Mayor (DM) Anthony (Tony) Anderson, Councilmembers (CMs) Barry Ladenburg, Kathryn Campbell, Terry Anderson, Dave Bush, and Pam Fernald.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS:** Kevin Bannon thanked Council for Agenda Bill #4082 (regarding property maintenance standards and junk vehicles).

Pat Jorgenson spoke against a natural gas station being built at South 170<sup>th</sup> Street and 31<sup>st</sup> Avenue South. She also stated her concern with limousines parking in the neighborhood.

Roger Kadeg spoke against the proposed option of pea patch/collective farm at Riverton Heights property.

Jo Ann Hill and Rick Forschler requested "and its committees" be placed back into the Council Administrative Procedures. They also stated that all meetings where CMs are present should be open to the public.

Earl Gipson spoke regarding code enforcement. He urged neighbors to help neighbors before calling the City and also cautioned Council to not go to extreme with the code changes.

Agenda Bill #4082; An Ordinance #15-1013 amending certain Sections of SeaTac Municipal Code (SMC) Chapters 7.15 and 7.25 regarding property maintenance standards and junk vehicles

Summary: One of the City Council's adopted goals is for an increased emphasis on code compliance throughout the city. In response to that goal, City staff developed a Code Compliance "Road Map," which was presented at the Council's retreat on June 29, 2015. One of the six initiatives is to "evaluate and present municipal code revisions." The proposed ordinances are the first product developed through that initiative. The proposed amendments to Chapter 7.15, Property Maintenance and 7.25, Junk Vehicles - Vehicle Storage, will provide Code Compliance staff with more effective regulatory tools for addressing the variety of received compliants. Both of these proposed amendments have been reviewed by the Code Compliance Core Team; the Code Compliance Executive Team; the City Council's Code Compliance Working Group; and the City Planning Commission (PC), which endorsed the proposals.

MOVED BY FERNALD, SECONDED BY CAMPBELL TO PASS AGENDA BILL #4082 (ORDINANCE #15-1013). MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.

**COMMITTEE UPDATES:** DM A. Anderson provided a National League of Cities (NLC) Public Safety & Crime Prevention Committee Meeting update.

CM Ladenburg reviewed South County Area Transportation Board (SCATBd) meeting.

**COUNCIL COMMENTS:** CM Fernald commented on the following: (1) surprised to see Riverton Heights Property on survey as option for pea patch; (2) working group meetings – reiterated her comments made at the September 22 CSS; and (3) October 9 – 5:30 p.m., Tukwila Pantry Food Bank Fall Fundraiser.

CM Bush comment on code compliance and the education efforts the City will undertake before becoming firm in most cases.

CM T. Anderson commented on the construction of houses on South 188th Street on Angle Lake and the courteous workers.

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**COUNCIL COMMENTS (continued):** CM Campbell commented on the following: (1) article in Backpage regarding warming waters causing a lot of fish deaths, (2) September 11 – Southwest King County Chamber of Commerce (SWKCC) lunch report from retiring Sea-Tac Airport Manager Mark Reis; (3) September 12 – attended Fiesta Patria, (4) September 13 – attended International Festival, (5) September 15 - Healthy Communities Affordable Housing Workshop, and (6) September 22 - Naturalization ceremony.

CM Ladenburg congratulated Mr. Doughty for winning the Good Neighbor Award. He also stated that Mayor Gregerson and he attended the Swim Races at Angle Lake. Angle Lake is being considered for the site of the 2017 National Swim Race events.

Mayor Gregerson commented on the following: (1) still vacancies on the Library, Human Services, and Hotel/Motel Tax Advisory Committees; (2) thanked everyone for the work at the International Festival; (3) residents on South 138<sup>th</sup> Street are concerned with parking on both sides of street from 24<sup>th</sup> Avenue South going west; and (4) thanked Council and staff for the discussion about working groups.

# 2015 FIRE PREVENITON WEEK CITY OF SEATAC PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, the city of SeaTac, WA is committed to ensuring the safety and security of all those living in and visiting

WHEREAS, fire is a serious public safety concern both locally and nationally, and homes are the locations where people are at greatest risk from fire; and

WHEREAS, home fires killed 2,755 people in the United States in 2013, according to the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), and fire departments in the United States responded to 369,500 home fires; and

WHEREAS, working smoke alarms cut the risk of dying in reported home fires in half; and

WHEREAS, half of home fire deaths take place at night between 11 p.m. and 7 a.m. when most people are asleep; and

WHEREAS, SeaTac residents should install smoke alarms in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, on every level of the home and install alert devices for people that are deaf or hard of hearing; and

WHEREAS, SeaTac first responders are dedicated to reducing the occurrence of home fires and home fire injuries through WHEREAS, SeaTac residents who have planned and practiced a home fire escape plan are more likely to survive a fire; and vrevention and protection education; and

WHEREAS, SeaTac residents are responsive to public education measures and are able to take personal steps to increase their safety from fire, especially in their homes; and

THEREFORE, I Mia Gregerson Mayor of SeaTac do hereby proclaim October 4-10, 2015, as Fire Prevention Week WHEREAS, the 2015 Fire Prevention Week theme, "Hear the Beep Where You Sleep. Every Bedroom Needs a Working Smoke Alarm!" effectively serves to remind us that we need working smoke alarms to give us the time to get out safely.
