Utility Tax Repealed

On December 8 the SeaTac City Council repealed the utility tax effective March 1, 2016. The six percent (6%) tax originally adopted in October 2014 applied to electric energy, natural or manufactured gas, solid waste (5%), surface water management, telephone, and cable television businesses within the city. The repeal does not change the ability of low-income senior citizens to apply for relief during the time period the tax was in effect. SR 509 Open House December 17

The Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) will host a neighborhood open house on Dec. 17 to provide information about the latest plans for the recently-funded <u>SR 509</u> Corridor Completion and Freight Improvement Project that is slated to be complete in 2031.

WSDOT plans to extend SR 509 to the south, creating new southern access to Sea-Tac International Airport, enhancing regional mobility and safety, and improving freight travel times and reliability. Event details are below.


