

Port Agreement Extension on Special Meeting Agenda

At the December 17 Special City Council Study Session, Councilmembers directed an amendment to the interlocal agreement with the Port of Seattle be considered at a Special Council Meeting December 22. This decision comes after almost a year of negotiating terms with the Port of Seattle.

In general, the amendment would extend the current 10 year agreement that expires February 16, 2016, to February 16, 2018. Other amendments would discontinue a set-aside of the commercial parking tax receipts previously reserved for constructing south access to the airport as well as funds dedicated to construction of two projects, one of which is completed.

The total impact to City of SeaTac revenues is to retain 36.9% or approximately \$2.0-2.5 million of parking tax revenues annually for City transportation projects. The amendment also extends a agreement on Port payment of stormwater management fees for Seattle-Tacoma International Airport properties.

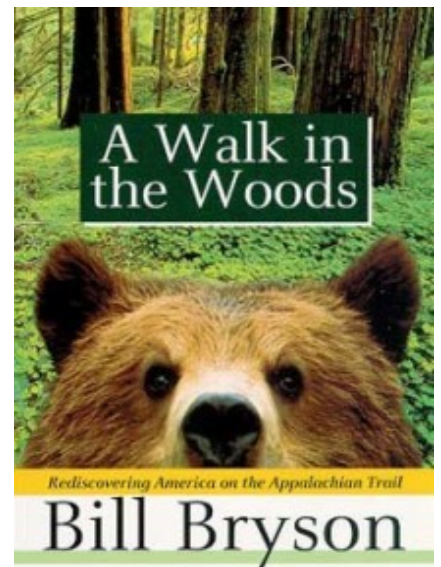

Suspicious Vehicle

On 12/11/2015 at about midnight Officer Dosio spotted a vehicle and occupants acting suspiciously outside the Motel 6 S. 188/47. He stopped the vehicle and took the occupants into custody after learning that the vehicle was stolen. The vehicle was full of items that were apparently stolen including 4 backpacks, 9 laptops, 3 I-Pads/tablets, 33 bank and ID cards, 3 wallets and assorted clothing. The occupants of the vehicle are being held on their warrants, pending additional charges.

Mail Theft

On 12/14/2015 an alert resident called 911 to report that two males were prowling mail boxes at the Puerta Villa Apartments S. 188/30. SeaTac Officers Ireland and Owens arrived within minutes and located two men matching the description. The ensuing investigation led officers to stolen mail in the pockets of both men, stolen credit cards and evidence of identity theft; a duffle bag containing additional pieces of stolen mail, screwdrivers and other tools frequently used for breaking locks were in the possession of the men. One was booked for Investigation Mail Theft and an Escape warrant, the other was booked for Investigation Mail Theft and Investigation Fraud.

*The cities of SeaTac and Burien have had a recent increase in this type of mail theft – from banks of locked mail boxes at apartment complexes. Retrieving mail quickly after it's delivered is one good way to combat this crime; reporting suspicious people or activities around mail boxes is another good way to safeguard your mail and personal information.
