Airport – Upcoming Tree Removal Program

Community members are invited to an information session April 11, 5:00 – 7:00 PM, at Highline Public Schools Educational Resource & Administrative Center, 15675 Ambaum Blvd. S.W., Burien, to learn about tree removal around Sea-Tac Airport. Port staff will be available to hear your comments and answer questions about scope, phasing and environmental practices during this work.

The Port expects to begin removing the first of 1600 trees this summer in the cities of SeaTac, Burien and Des Moines to help ensure safe aircraft takeoffs and landings. These trees either are or soon will grow tall enough to penetrate the airport's airspace if not removed. Tree removal on publicly owned and commercial properties is planned for 2017, and residential properties in 2018. Replanting with more low-growing, compatible species will follow.
