Where: Meet in the north parking lot of the Des Moines Beach Park (upstream, over the car

bridge, at the circular driveway). Please be on time, so the group can discuss the work

and start as a team.



What to Bring: Energy, work gloves, rubber boots that can get muddy, snacks and water. Please dress for the weather/work conditions. Bring rain pants and knee pads if you have them as much of the work requires bending over or kneeling to pull and dig ivy. Some people bring cardboard to kneel on. Tools will be provided, but please bring your favorite weeding tools. Please bring the following items if you have them: picks, Mattox's, two-way saws, loppers, and crow bars as they are especially helpful in ivy removal.

Children are welcome, under 12 with one-on-one adult supervision.

King County Wastemobile Opportunity for SeaTac Residents



The Wastemobile travels to many communities to provide hazardous waste disposal services for King County residents and qualifying businesses. The Wastemobile operates Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 10:00 AM - 5:00 PM. The Wastemobile accepts a wide variety of materials and is free of charge. All King County residents can safely dispose of aerosol cans (if not empty), household cleaners, hobby chemicals, oil-based paint, pesticides, spray paint, thinners & other solvents, and many other household hazardous waste items at no cost at the Wastemobile events.

SeaTac residents are encouraged to bring their household hazardous waste to the Wastemobile collection event in Des Moines for the weekend listed below.

Dates: Friday, April 22 – Sunday, April 24

Hours: 10:00 AM – 5:00 PM

Location: 22307 Dock St., Des Moines Marina

Restrictions: No latex paint accepted. There is a limit of 50 gallons total hazardous waste per residential customer (25 gallon limit for qualifying businesses) per day at all Wastemobile events. No more than 30 gallons of gasoline will be accepted from residents (25 gallon limit for qualifying businesses). No containers over five gallons in size will be accepted. Limit of 10 fluorescent tubes/bulbs.



Safe handling: Do not mix products. Keep products in their original containers; label products that are not in their original containers. Secure products so they do not tip over and/or leak; transport similar, sealed containers upright, in cardboard boxes. Secure the load in the vehicle or trailer, and store products away from the passenger compartment.

The traveling Wastemobile is funded through a surcharge on solid waste disposal and wastewater discharge. As a result, residents bringing material to the Wastemobile are not charged a fee on site. The cost premium underscores the importance of making waste prevention a King County top priority.


