


City Manager's Weekly Update May 13, 2016


Valley View Library will be closed May 30 for Memorial Day Family Story Times

POLICE NEWS

Officers Fight to Take Man with Gun into Custody

Early on the morning of Sunday, May 8
SeaTac Officers contacted several people in
two vehicles, parked in the middle of the
road in the S 18500 Block of 42nd Avenue
S. Due to a number of factors including the
proximity to a known problem house,
officers believed a drug deal had just taken
place or was about to take place. As they
investigated, one of the males took a



handgun from his waist and raised it toward an officer who was able to break it out of his hands to avoid being shot. Three officers fought to take the male, a convicted felon, into custody. Officers ultimately used a taser to gain compliance and get him into custody. With the exception of abrasions and bruises, the officers who were placed in this fight-for-life were uninjured. Officers recovered 4.4 grams of cocaine, the firearm which was fully loaded with 16 rounds of ammunition and a fully loaded 30 round magazine. The male was evaluated by fire/medics and booked into King County Jail for Illegal possession of narcotics, illegal possession of a firearm and assault with a handgun.

Officers Recover Stolen Firearm and Narcotics

On Monday, May 9 at about 11:30 PM SeaTac Officers contacted a suspicious vehicle parked in the Silver Dollar Casino parking lot. A fully loaded handgun was visible in the console area of the car. Officers detained the male occupant to safely investigate further. They learned that the handgun was stolen. A quantity of heroine was located as well. The vehicle was impounded, pending a search warrant to investigate further. The driver was booked into King County Jail for illegal possession of a stolen firearm and illegal possession of narcotics.



National Peace Officer's Memorial Day

Peace Officers Memorial Day is an observance in the United States that pays tribute to the local, state, and Federal peace officers who have died in the line of duty. The observance takes place on May 15, is sponsored by the National Fraternal Order of Police and is implemented by the National FOP Memorial Committee. On Friday May 13, the flag at City Hall will be lowered to half staff, in support of this event. Temporary closure of S. 200th Street

Sound Transit is restoring area roads in preparation for opening the Angle Lake Station this fall. Sound Transit crews will be building a new culvert over Des Moines Creek along S. 200th Street beginning as early as Wednesday, June 1. S. 200th Street will be closed to thru traffic between Des Moines Memorial Drive and SR 99/ International Boulevard to perform this work. Local access will be provided east and west of the creek.

A full road closure is needed to get the work completed in a safe and efficient manner. This work is expected to take approximately two months to complete.

Comprehensive Plan Amendment Process

The City is providing an opportunity to propose amendments to the Comprehensive Plan, including the comprehensive plan map and any elements (subarea Plans, Shoreline Master Program, etc.). Final action will be taken by the City Council in November or December of this year.

Process: Anyone wishing to propose an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan must submit a Comprehensive Plan Amendment application and SEPA Environmental Checklist, which are available at the SeaTac Permit Center or on the City's website www.ci.seatac.wa.us.

Application Deadline: 5:00 PM, Wednesday, June 1, 2016

Application Fees: \$4,280.00 total (Amendment application + SEPA fees)

Application Requirements: All applications must be clearly and completely filled out and filed at the City's Permit Center. The application contains questions that require written responses. City staff will be available to provide assistance and answer questions about the application process.
