The National Weather Service has issued a *Heat Advisory* for western Washington through Saturday. Here is a list of local air-conditioned cooling centers and their hours of operation to help you beat the heat. All of the locations will have free bottled water available.

# **High-Impact Road Closures**

At least two lanes will remain open, except during the overnight hours on Friday and Sunday, when only one lane may be open. This work is weather dependent.



# **Safety Exercise**

On Saturday, August 20, the Kent Regional Fire Authority will be participating with Sound Transit in a required, pre-service safety exercise at the new light rail station located at S. 200th Street west of International Blvd. The scheduled start time is 8:30 AM.

The purpose of the exercise is to help emergency responders prepare for potential incidents on the elevated rail system once passenger service begins. The goal is to ensure the safety of commuters and firefighters in the unlikely event of an actual emergency.

Firefighters from throughout south King County, as well as the Seattle Fire Department, will be participating in the exercise. They will be simulating a train derailment and fire with people acting as injured passengers. Actors will be wearing makeup that simulates various injuries.

Because the tracks are elevated, fire department ladder trucks will be used to gain access to the train and patients.

The City of SeaTac will also be activating its Emergency Operations Center while the drill is in progress. During an actual incident, the EOC would support the operation with planning, logistics, and resources.

# **SeaTac Police Participated in State Wide Traffic Safety Emphasis**

July 31 - August 14, SeaTac Police Officers participated in a state wide traffic safety emphasis funded by a grant from the Washington Traffic Safety Commission. Officers dedicated 44 hours of time to the emphasis. They issued 85 citations (9 for speeding, 13 for driving with a suspended license, 4 for driving with no valid license and many others for a variety of moving violations). Fifty-five stops/contacts resulted in education based warnings; one resulted in a felony warrant arrest.

# Police Chief for a Day - Motorcade Through SeaTac

This program is the result of a partnership between local law enforcement agencies and hospitals. Hosted by the Washington State Criminal Justice Training Center (WSCJTC) in Normandy Park, Chief for a Day allows thirty medically vulnerable children from around the state to focuses on their dreams, not their illness. They are paired with a sponsoring police chief to become that agency's "Chief for a Day".

Each child was escorted by police motorcade to the WSCJTC on the morning of August 18. Wearing a hand-tailored uniform from their sponsoring agency, each child was formally sworn in as Chief or Sheriff for the day. After the ceremony, the new Chiefs and Sheriffs were treated to displays and presentations including K-9, bike and horses patrol, SWAT, helicopter and motorcycles. SeaTac Police assisted with the motorcade procession, closing roads temporarily to ensure that these VIPs go to their destination safely.
