1. Call to Order	Deputy Mayor Fernald called the meeting to order at 5:01 PM
2. SeaTac Dangerous Dog Ordinance (attached)	<p><u>X</u> Informational Presentation with Q & A <u>X</u> Recommended Action</p> <p><i>Deputy Mayor Fernald asked the committee to consider removing breed specific language, from the SeaTac Dangerous Dog Ordinance (SMC 6.05.110). She provided some information on the topic.</i></p> <p><i>Guest speaker, Sgt. Tim Anderson from King County Animal Control, provided background information on the topic as well as some statistics about the types and number of dangerous dog calls they get in the SeaTac. He relayed that other cities are getting away from breed specific language in their dangerous dog ordinances. It is difficult to enforce, largely due to the difficulty in determining a dog's true breed. He relayed that removing the breed-specific language would not weaken the current language of the ordinance.</i></p> <p><i>Deputy Mayor Fernald requested Public Comment. There was public agreement that removing breed specific language was a good idea. Joe Adamack asked if the Committee was open for other revisions to the code. He will send his revision suggestions to the committee.</i></p> <p><i>ACTION ITEM: Sgt. Anderson will provide me with additional stats as requested by Committee. I will forward it to all members.</i></p> <p><i>RECOMMENDATION: prepare an ordinance to amend City Code to eliminate the reference to "breed specific". DM will make this</i></p>

	<p><i>recommendation during next Council Meeting – council comments. Upon Council direction, staff will prepare full presentation for Council Study Session.</i></p>

Address/Numbering System</p>	<p><u>X</u> Discussion <u>X</u> Recommended Action</p> <p><i>Fire Chief Wiwel presented information on the King County Street Grid, the basic rules of the system and how it should work to ensure safe, effective and efficient emergency response to homes and businesses in SeaTac. He showed examples of improperly addressed locations in the City that slow response time and endanger our citizens. He asked that the committee consider fixing high priority examples as well as adhere to the addressing rules going forward. Gary Schenk and Chief Mulligan support this request/proposal.</i></p> <p><i>RECOMMENDATION: After much discussion, the Committee recommended that Chief Wiwel bring the information to the full Council in the form of a presentation with request for direction at September Council Study Session.</i></p> <p><i>ACM Scorcio asked that this be done in time for budget consideration as a decision card would need to be introduced to fund the analysis necessary to move forward with the Chief Wiwel's request.</i></p>
