

Special Council Meeting for Public Input on the ST3 Ballot Proposition

SeaTac, WA (October 3, 2016) – The City Council will hold a Special Council Meeting on Thursday, October 6, 2016, from 5:00 – 6:00 PM at the SeaTac Community Center Banquet Room located at 13735 24th Ave S., SeaTac. A Town Hall Meeting will immediately follow beginning at 6:00 PM.

Public comments related to Agenda Bill #4462: RCW 42.17A.555 requires that proponents and opponents of the ballot proposition are afforded an approximately equal opportunity for the expression of viewpoints. Therefore, all proponents of the ballot measure will be allocated a maximum of 15 minutes collectively, and all opponents of the ballot measure will be allocated a maximum of 15 minutes collectively. Members of the public are encouraged to communicate with each other prior to comment, so that these time limits can be observed. Comments related to this item will only be taken at this time.

After hearing the comments, the Special City Council Meeting Agenda allows for 20 minutes of Council discussion regarding whether the City Council wishes to take a collective position regarding Sound Transit Proposition No. 1 (commonly referred to as ST3). The City Council may then take action on Agenda Bill 4462, a Resolution taking a collective position regarding Sound Transit Proposition No. 1.

About the City of SeaTac:

Incorporated in February 1990, the City of SeaTac is located approximately midway between the cities of Seattle and Tacoma. The City of SeaTac is 10 square miles in area and has a population of 28,251. The City is a vibrant community, economically strong, environmentally sensitive, and people-oriented. The City boundaries surround the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport, (approximately 3 square miles in area) which is owned and operated by the Port of Seattle.
