
Neighborhood Sidewalk Committee

Port of Seattle Commission held Community Meeting on Tree Removal Program

The Port's Community Meeting held at Bow Lake Elementary on Tuesday evening was attended by more than 100 local residents, mostly from SeaTac. The Meeting and Open House was on the Airport's proposed Flight Corridor Safety Program that will remove 3,000 trees around Sea-Tac Airport in the next 3 years.

The Port had various display stations with details about the project, its connection with FAA regulations, and plans to plant new and shorter trees and shrubs. Airport staff answered individual questions during the Open House portion. During the Community Meeting, the elected Port Commissioner's received many comments, questions and detailed information from the audience.

The Commissioners did not take any action about the proposed program at the meeting. The City's appeal of the Port's initial environmental determination is still pending resolution, either by mutual agreement or by a decision in Superior Court.

Intersection Improvements at Military Road and S. 200th Street

Construction work by WSDOT is continuing on the Southbound I-5 interchange at Military Road S. and S. 200th Street. This work will widen and realign the intersection and install new traffic signals to allow for easier access between I-5 and, the Angle Lake Light Rail Station, and the City

- · Bridge work is ongoing



Construction on 24th Avenue S. Overlay Project (S. 142nd Street to S. 128th Street) is nearing completion

Construction is nearing completion for this project. The remaining items to complete are installation of channelization/pavement markings, fences and area drains, and restoring property impacted by the project. Installation of fences and area drains were being installed this week. The channelization and pavement marking work requires drier weather conditions to install. Guns, DUIs and Warrants

In the month of October 2016, SeaTac Officers:

- Took (2) guns off of the streets during a suspicious person/vehicle/narcotics investigations.
- Took (12) impaired, dangerous drivers off the streets (DUIs).
- Arrested (62) people on outstanding misdemeanor and felony warrants.

Armed Diamond Robbery – I-5/S. 188th Street

At about noon on October 25, diamond couriers were forced off the road and robbed of \$300,000-\$400,000 worth of jewels, at gun point. No one was injured. This incident occurred on the entrance ramp from S. 188 St to northbound I-5. King County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Detectives are investigating. Suspects remain at large.

Contact with Suspicious Vehicle leads to Gun, Drugs

On October 10 at about 2:00 AM, Deputy Atterbury saw a suspicious, occupied vehicle parked in the rear lot of the Motel 6 at S. 189th Street and 47th Avenue S. His investigation included a warrant to search the car. The search revealed \$6,600 cash, 21 grams of heroin, 21 grams of methamphetamine, miscellaneous pills, a loaded .45 caliber handgun with laser sight, multiple holsters and police-style equipment (believed to be stolen). The driver was charged with violation of the Uniform Controlled Substance Act.
