CONSTRUCTION ALERTS

Intersection Improvements at Military Road and S. 200th Street

Construction work by WSDOT is continuing on the southbound I-5 interchange at Military Road S. and S. 200th Street. This work will widen and realign the intersection and install new traffic signals to allow for easier access between I-5 and, the Angle Lake Light Rail Station and the City of SeaTac. Construction is rapidly moving along for the Connecting 28th/24th Avenue S. project. Work recently completed or ongoing includes:

- Stabilization of exposed soils during wet weather is ongoing
- Bridge work is ongoing
- Delivery of large tunnel pieces will start Nov. 14. Delivery route will be north on Highway 99 from Tacoma, then north on International Blvd and west on South 204th St to the project site.

Recology CleanScapes 2017 Rate Adjustment

The annual rate adjustment for Recology CleanScapes customers will take effect January 1, 2017. There are two components of the new rates – the Annual Rate Adjustment that is part of Recology CleanScapes contract and an increase by Metropolitan King County Council in solid waste disposal fees at all King County transfer stations. Both adjustments will be reflected in the 2017 rates. So the basic rate for a residential 45 gallon tote monthly service, which includes recycling and yard & food waste, will increase by \$1.11 (\$0.91 King County disposal increase; \$0.20 Recology CleanScapes for their annual adjustment). This rate does not include the moderate risk waste surcharge and states refuse tax that are itemized separately on customer's invoices. Self-haulers will also have the King County disposal increase reflected in the cost to dispose of their garbage at King County transfer stations starting January 1, 2017. 2017 rates will be on the Recology CleanScapes service guides customers should receive in December.

DUI Stop Leads to Narcotics Arrest

On November 3 at about 2:20 AM Deputy Pat Kelly saw a car moving at very slow speeds on International Blvd. approaching S. 188th Street. He could see that the driver was asleep or passed out behind the wheel. The car moved slowly through the red light at S. 188th Street, jumped the curb at



the gas station and continued to roll toward the fence in the lot. Using his siren, Deputy Kelly was able to get the driver to wake up and stop the car before hitting anything. The driver was initially arrested for DUI but was booked into King County Jail for narcotics violations after Deputy Kelly found 22 grams of heroin, 19.8 grams of crack cocaine, 7.9 grams of cocaine and 14 oxycodone pills in his pockets.
