Comcast Utility Tax Update

The City met with a representative from Comcast last week to finalize the timeline for SeaTac residents who are Comcast customers to receive the credit due to them for overcollected Utility taxes. Comcast reported that customers should see the one-time credit on bills run between 1/23/17 and 2/21/17. Bills will include a message stating "This credit is applied to this bill due to the incorrect application of utility taxes for the City of SeaTac." City of SeaTac Road Design and Construction Standards Stakeholders Group is Forming

The City of SeaTac is beginning a process to develop Road Design and Construction Standards and is forming a stakeholders group to provide feedback during the process. The stakeholders group will be comprised of developers, contractors and consultants who provide services within the City of SeaTac and any other interested parties.

The Road Design and Construction Standards are being developed to:

- Set forth specific, consistent and acceptable road design and construction elements for developers and other private parties constructing or modifying road or right-of-way facilities which require City licenses or permits.
- To establish uniform criteria to guide the City's own design and construction of new City roads or reconstruction of existing roads.

The stakeholders group will meet approximately once every six weeks throughout the development of the standards with the entire process expected to last a year. Meetings are scheduled to occur on Wednesday evenings from 5:00 PM to 6:00 PM with the first one planned for February 01 in the Riverton Room at the City Hall.

CONSTRUCTION AND TRAFFIC ALERTS

Intersection Improvements at Military Road S. and S 200th Street

Construction work by WSDOT is continuing on the Southbound I-5 interchange at Military Road South and South 200th Street. This work will widen and realign the intersection and install new traffic signals to allow for easier access between I-5 and, the Angle Lake Light Rail Station, and the City of SeaTac. Please plan alternate routes around the area if possible. Please contact 440.4DOT (4368) for any noise related complaints or the 24-hour construction hotline at 888.298.2395.

What to expect:

- The intersection will be rebuilt in phases to minimize impacts to the traveling public.
- Motorists should expect travel delays during construction on South 200th Street, Military Road, the southbound I-5 off-ramp to South 200th Street/Military Road, and the South 200th Street/ Military Road on-ramp to southbound I-5 with increased delays during weekday commuting hours.
- Lanes may be reduced during construction. There may also be periodic I-5 ramp closures at this location. Signage and flaggers will help motorists and pedestrians get safely around the work zone. Ramp closures will be announced in advance using electronic message signs.
- Typical work times will be between 7 am and 5 pm on weekdays and nighttime work will also be happening. The City of SeaTac has approved a noise variance for nighttime work for this project.
- Expect noise from equipment breaking up and removing existing sections of asphalt and other activities (trucks, excavators, bulldozers, vactor trucks, drill rigs, sawcutting equipment). Lighting will be used to illuminate the work area during nighttime hours.



Daily Road Closure on Des Moines Memorial Drive

On January 11, Water District #49 started replacing a water main on Des Moines Memorial Dr. between Ambaum Blvd S. and S. 176th Street, closing Des Moines Memorial Drive in this vicinity during the day for approximately 2 months.

The daily road closure will take place on weekdays from 7:00 AM – 5:00 PM, with accommodations made for morning and afternoon Metro buses to pass through the work zone. Update - January 19, 2017 Homicide Investigation

On January 19, 2017 a SeaTac resident was shot and killed in his home by a bullet that entered the residence from the outside, during a drive-by type shooting. Since the moment of the shooting, King County Sheriff's Office Major Crimes Detectives and other law enforcement agencies have been working to identify and capture the suspect(s).

For neighbors and residents of SeaTac and the surrounding community who are afraid and trying to come to grips with this tragic and senseless act of violence please know that this was not a random crime. While this piece of information will likely do little to make residents of this neighborhood feel safer, the fact that we know it wasn't random, means that we have specific leads to follow. Our investigators are following them tirelessly.
