Community Meeting - Waterfront Park at the Hughes Property

A new two acre waterfront park will be constructed on a portion of the former Hughes property site just south of Angle Lake Park. John Barker Landscape Architects has developed a design for the park and we will share the latest design at a Community Meeting on Wednesday, March 29, 6:00 - 8:00 PM at City Hall Council Chambers. The park will improve public access and provide opportunities to walk and enjoy the beautiful shoreline setting on the south west shore of Angle Lake. An eight foot wide trail will provide a connection from Angle Lake Park to the new waterfront park. Stay Informed and Aware During an Emergency

The City of SeaTac has instituted the CodeRED Emergency Notification System - an ultra high-speed telephone communication service for emergency notifications. This system allows us to telephone all or targeted areas of the City in case of an emergency situation that requires immediate action (such as a boil-water notice, missing child or evacuation notices). It then delivers our recorded message to a live person or an answering machine, making three attempts to connect to any number.

However, this system is only as good as the telephone number database that supports it. If your phone number is not in the database, you will not be called. Individuals and businesses are given the ability to add their own phone numbers directly into the system's database. No one should automatically assume his or her phone number is included. All individuals and businesses should go to the City of SeaTac webpage and follow the link in the upper left to get to the "CodeRED Community Notification Enrollment" page. Those without Internet access may call the City of SeaTac Fire Department at 206.973.4500 to supply their information over the phone. Required information includes first and last name, street address (physical address, no P.O. boxes), city, state, zip code, and primary phone number, additional phone numbers can be entered as well.


There is no charge to register for or use CodeRED and your personal information will be kept confidential.



Public Works Project Updates

Connecting 28th/24th Avenue S.

Project extends new roadway and non-motorized improvements from the intersection of S. 200th Street and 26th Avenue S. to the intersection of S. 208th Street and 24th Avenue S. It completes the





gap in the 28th/24th corridor and provides an alternate north/south arterial to SR 99. It mitigates congestion and improves multimodal access to the Angle Lake Light Rail Station in lieu of widening SR 99. The project is a regional partnership between SeaTac, Sound Transit, Port of Seattle, WSDOT and Des Moines. Access will enable development of adjacent properties.

Update:

- Installation of wingwall panels on tunnel structure completed.
- Tunnel backfilling completed on March 17
- Installation of illumination poles is ongoing.
- Site restoration is continuing landscaping, tree planting and general tidying up.
- Bridge deck pour completed on March 19
- · Excavation for block walls has begun.
- Continue erosion and sediment control.
- Begin approach slab work.

Intersection Improvements at Military Road S. and S 200th Street

Beginning Monday, March 27 the Contractor will begin paving work within this intersection from 9:00 PM – 5:00 AM. They will start by closing the I-5 on/off ramp to grind existing pavement. They will also be grinding pavement on S. 200th Street from the edge of Military Road S. to approximately 300' (west). Lane closures on S. 200th Street and Military Road S. are expected for this work.

Traffic control will consist of an off-duty officer and flaggers. Detour is only for I-5 ramp closure. No detour for S. 200th Street or Military Road S. is scheduled as they will still have limited access through the area. Paving of this area is scheduled in following weeks (weather depending). The paving will also occur at night and follow the same arrangements.



Reducing Waste and Reusing Furniture!

On Wednesday, March 22, the City's Human Services agencies were invited to visit old Fire Station 45 to select old furniture items that are no longer being used. The furniture became available after the fire fighters moved to the newly constructed Fire Station 45 in May 2016. Instead of disposing of all of the used furniture, staff contacted the agencies to see if they could utilize any of the remaining items such as filing cabinets, bookshelves and chairs. While most of the furniture was well worn, many pieces could have a second or third life in another setting. The agencies provided their own staff and transportation to take the furniture they selected. Human Services agencies that participated included Tukwila Food Bank, Des Moines Food Bank, Navos and the Children's Therapy Center. Staff is doing their best to find ways and places to reuse and recycle the useable furniture prior to demolition of the building later this year.

Results of New Traffic Safety Emphasis Campaign

During the first two weeks of March SeaTac Police participated in a WA Traffic Safety Commission (WTSC) Emphasis campaign titled "5 to Stay Alive". This grant-funded emphasis was created to address speeding, DUI, distracted driving and seatbelts. In 28 total hours, Deputies Conner, Kyle, Fowler and Crawley made 87 contacts which resulted in 54 infractions, 45 warnings and 5 criminal citations.

LifeSaver Award Presented to SeaTac Deputy Zach Brubaker

On March 21, the Chief of the Metro Transit Police Department came to City Hall to present SeaTac Deputy Zach Brubaker with a LifeSaver Award. The incident occurred on November 9, 2016 as Zach and his partners were working for Metro Transit Police at a protest near Westlake Park in Seattle. From their post, Zach and his partner heard gunshots and responded to find five people shot on the street. Zach was able to apply a tourniquet to stop one victim's bleeding while his partner tended to another victim. Major Jutilla expressed his sincere appreciation for Zach's efforts that night and his time in service to Metro.
