King County Wastemobile Opportunity for SeaTac Residents

The Wastemobile travels to many communities to provide hazardous waste disposal services for King County residents and qualifying businesses. The Wastemobile operates Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 10:00 AM - 5:00 PM. The Wastemobile accepts a wide variety of materials and is free of charge. All King County residents can safely dispose of aerosol cans (if not empty), household cleaners, hobby chemicals, oil-based paint, pesticides, spray paint, thinners & other solvents, and many other household hazardous waste items at no cost at the Wastemobile events.

SeaTac residents are encouraged to bring their household hazardous waste to the Wastemobile collection event in Burien for the weekend listed below.

Dates: Friday, September 22 – Sunday, September 24

Hours: 10:00 AM - 5:00 PM

Location: 425 SW 144th Street, Burien

Restrictions: No latex paint accepted. There is a limit of 50 gallons total hazardous waste per residential customer (25 gallon limit for qualifying businesses) per day at all Wastemobile events. No more than 30 gallons of gasoline will be accepted from residents (25 gallon limit for qualifying businesses). No containers over five gallons in size will be accepted. Limit of 10 fluorescent tubes/bulbs.

Safe handling: Do not mix products. Keep products in their original containers; label products that are not in their original containers. Secure products so they do not tip over and/or leak; transport similar, sealed containers upright, in cardboard boxes. Secure the load in the vehicle or trailer, and store products away from the passenger compartment.

The traveling Wastemobile is funded through a surcharge on solid waste disposal and wastewater discharge. As a result, residents bringing material to the Wastemobile are not charged a fee on site. The cost premium underscores the importance of making waste prevention a King County top priority.

Public Works Project Updates

2017 Overlay Project

The following roadways will be included in the 2017 overlay: 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. between S. 200th Street and S. 207th Street and S. 207th Street between 12th Place S. and 14th Avenue S. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits. An ILA is being drawn up between the City and HWD to incorporate the water line replacement work into the 2017 Overlay project plans.

• 90% plans, specifications and estimate review have been completed. A meeting to discuss the review comments will be scheduled in September. Construction is planned for March/April 2018.

S. 168th Street Stormwater System Improvements

 SCI Infrastructure has been awarded the construction project. The pre-construction conference is scheduled to occur on September 26. Construction will begin shortly thereafter.

ADA (American Disability Act) Transition Plan

 Data collection is ongoing. A data collection interactive portal has been established to monitor progress.

Permit Parking Program

 The first round of data acquisition is complete. A draft "Best Management Practices" document is in development. A public meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 25 at the City Hall Council Chambers.

Military Road and S. 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of buffered bike lanes; curb and gutter; sidewalks; new pavement; installation of street lighting; upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings; construction of a right turn lane on eastbound S. 152nd Street; and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Blvd. and Military Road S. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Preparation of geotechnical report has begun.
- Began determination of stormwater impacts.
- Continuing to develop 30% plans.

S. 166th Street Sidewalk Project

This Safe Routes to School Program grant funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk and radar speed feedback signs. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Topographic survey is complete and the base map has been submitted.
- Work on NEPA permit is ongoing.
- Storm design requirements and predesign are underway.
- A draft schedule has been developed.
- Public meeting is tentatively scheduled for October 10.

2018 Overlay Project

This project will reconstruct Military Road S. between S. 209th Street and the I-5 bridge. Work will include "rubbelization" of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, roadway channelization, and permanent signing.

• A selection committee reviewed and scored consultant proposals on August 17. KPG, Inc. was selected to design this project. A project scoping meeting is scheduled for August 29. The design contract is scheduled for Council review at the September 12 Council Study Session.

35th Avenue Safety Improvement Project

 Pavement repair areas and guardrail replacement has been field marked and design documents are being developed.

POLICE NEWS

SeaTac Carjacking Associated with Burien Robbery/Shooting

On the night of September 11, SeaTac Police responded to reports of a carjacking in the area of S. 180th Street/35th Avenue S. The victim was in his car when he was approached by three males. He was ordered out of his car at gunpoint. The car was stolen; the victim was uninjured.

The following night in the City of Burien, Police responded to a shooting at a marijuana shop in the 11000 block of 1st Avenue S. They learned that there had been a robbery and an employee had been shot. The vehicle used by the robbery suspects was the same one that had been stolen in the carjacking in SeaTac. It was recovered nearby after being abandoned by the suspects who remain at large. King County Major Crimes Detectives are investigating, with assistance from SeaTac Police Detectives.

Stabbing – S. 200th Street/International Blvd.

In the early morning hours of Friday, September 8 a SeaTac Deputy driving on International Blvd. near S. 200th Street, saw a man in the median, in distress. He investigated and found that the man had been stabbed. He learned that the victim had been approached by a man who asked for a cigarette. When he told the man he didn't have one, the man stabbed him in the stomach and walked away. The victim is expected to survive the wound. The suspect remains at large. King County Major Crimes Detectives are investigating.
