Neighborhood Update

To help ensure safe takeoffs and landings, the Port of Seattle plans to remove and replant trees around Seattle-Tacoma International Airport.

These trees either are, or soon will be, tall enough to encroach upon the airport's airspace. Two Port-owned sites where removal and replanting will occur, are adjacent to homes along 15th Avenue S.

Removal work on the sites will start in late- September. Tree felling operations will begin on September 25 on the golf course and then move to south of S. 200th Street on September 26. We are anticipating that it will take approximately 3 weeks to complete the tree felling. Replanting is scheduled to take place October 2017 through March 2018.

Because it is an active construction zone, signage and fencing will be installed at both sites and an air horn will be used periodically for the safety of construction staff.

The contractor for P-4 and P-5 will be will be using the two blast air horn "all clear" protocol every time they plan on felling a tree. This is their signal to their own personnel that the area is clear and it is safe to fell the tree. Prior to felling trees, a sweep of the area will be done to ensure no non-essential personnel/public are in the area. The contractor will follow all applicable City of SeaTac noise ordinance regulations. The contractor's work hours will be approximately 7:00 AM to 4:00 PM.

King County Wastemobile Opportunity for SeaTac Residents

The Wastemobile travels to many communities to provide hazardous waste disposal services for King County residents and qualifying businesses. The Wastemobile operates Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 10:00 AM - 5:00 PM. The Wastemobile accepts a wide variety of materials and is free of charge. All King County residents can safely dispose of aerosol cans (if not empty), household cleaners, hobby chemicals, oil-based paint, pesticides, spray paint, thinners & other solvents, and many other household hazardous waste items at no cost at the Wastemobile events.

SeaTac residents are encouraged to bring their household hazardous waste to the Wastemobile collection event in Burien for the weekend listed below.

Dates: Friday, September 22 – Sunday, September 24

Hours: 10:00 AM - 5:00 PM

Location: 425 SW 144th Street, Burien

Restrictions: No latex paint accepted. There is a limit of 50 gallons total hazardous waste per residential customer (25 gallon limit for qualifying businesses) per day at all Wastemobile events. No more than 30 gallons of gasoline will be accepted from residents (25 gallon limit for qualifying businesses). No containers over five gallons in size will be accepted. Limit of 10 fluorescent tubes/bulbs.

Safe handling: Do not mix products. Keep products in their original containers; label products that are not in their original containers. Secure products so they do not tip over and/or leak; transport similar, sealed containers upright, in cardboard boxes. Secure the load in the vehicle or trailer, and store products away from the passenger compartment.

The traveling Wastemobile is funded through a surcharge on solid waste disposal and wastewater discharge. As a result, residents bringing material to the Wastemobile are not charged a fee on site. The cost premium underscores the importance of making waste prevention a King County top priority.

Public Works Project Updates

2017 Overlay Project

The following roadways will be included in the 2017 overlay: 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. between S. 200th Street and S. 207th Street and S. 207th Street between 12th Place S. and 14th Avenue S. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits. An ILA is being drawn up between the City and HWD to incorporate the water line replacement work into the 2017 Overlay project plans.

• 90% plans, specifications and estimate review have been completed. A meeting to discuss the review comments will be scheduled in September. Construction is planned for March/April 2018.

S. 168th Street Stormwater System Improvements

 SCI Infrastructure has been awarded the construction project. The pre-construction conference is scheduled to occur on September 26. Construction will begin shortly thereafter. PSE will relocate the gas lines in conflict with the project by the end of next week. Notification of the start of construction will be provided to the residents this week.

ADA (American Disability Act) Transition Plan

 Data collection is ongoing. A data collection interactive portal has been established to monitor progress.

Permit Parking Program

 The first round of data acquisition is complete. A draft "Best Management Practices" document is in development. A public meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 25 at the City Hall Council Chambers.

Military Road and S. 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project in curb and gutter; sidewalks; new pavement; installation of street signalization with pedestrian crossings; construction of a right t and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila Interr project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Preparation of geotechnical report is continuing.
- Determination of stormwater impacts is continuing.
- Traffic model is being developed to determine traffic impa
- Project coordination meeting is scheduled for September



S. 166th Street Sidewalk Project

This Safe Routes to School Program grant funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk and radar speed feedback signs. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Topographic survey is complete and the base map has been submitted.
- Work on NEPA permit is ongoing.
- Storm design requirements and predesign are underway.
- A draft schedule has been developed.

Public meeting is scheduled for October 25.

2018 Overlay Project

This project will reconstruct Military Road S. between S. 209th Street and the I-5 bridge. Work will include "rubbelization" of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, roadway channelization, and permanent signing.

 A selection committee reviewed and scored consultant proposals on August 17. KPG, Inc. was selected to design this project. A project scoping meeting is scheduled for August 29. The design contract is scheduled for Council review at the September 12 Council Study Session.

35th Avenue Safety Improvement Project

 Pavement repair areas and guardrail replacement has been field marked and design documents are being developed.

S. 200th Street/26th Avenue Intersection Project

The scope of this project includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at S. 200th Street and 26th Avenue S., installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, pedestrian signal upgrades, signal loop detectors and channelization.

• A Request for Qualifications was advertised on August 14. Eight firms submitted statements of qualifications. A selection committee scored the submittals and selected KPG, Inc. to design the project. The project will be reviewed at the September 26 Council Study Session
