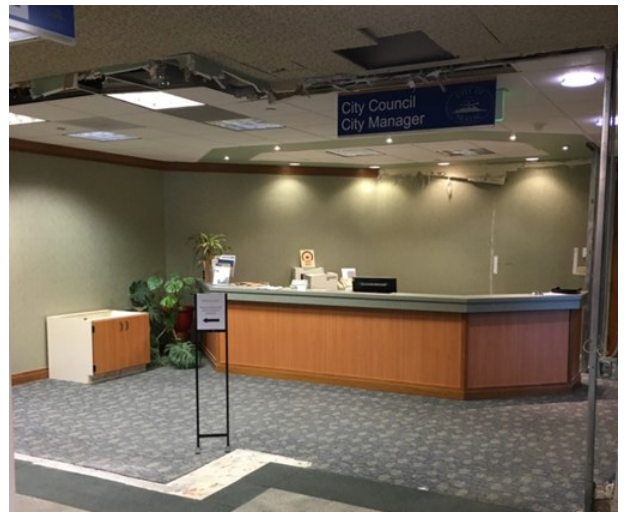

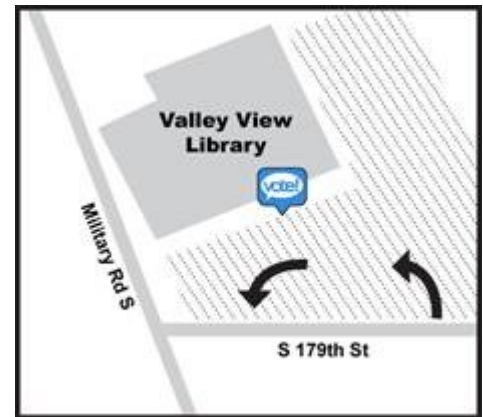

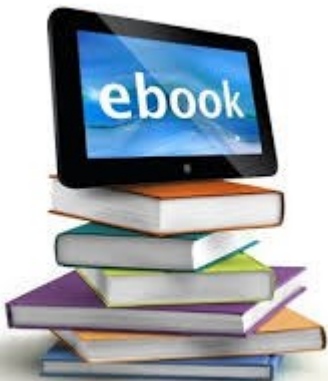

Public Works Project Updates

12th Place and 13th Avenue S. Overlay Project

The scope of this project includes pavement repair, asphalt paving and stormwater improvements on 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. between S. 200th Street and S. 207th Street and S. 207th Street between 12th Place S. and 14th Avenue S. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits.

- 90% plans, specifications and estimate review is complete
- Construction is planned for March/April 2018

S. 168th Street Stormwater System Improvements

- Storm pipe and catch basin installation is nearing completion
- Restoration work is ongoing.

ADA (American Disability Act) Transition Plan

- Data collection is complete.
- A public meeting is scheduled on November 9, 6:00 PM in the Council Chambers

Permit Parking Program

- Draft “Best Management Practices” document and matrix of proposed treatments is complete and should be ready for internal review by late October

Military Road and S. 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of buffered bike lanes; curb and gutter; sidewalks; new pavement; installation of street lighting; upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings; construction of a right turn lane on eastbound S. 152nd Street; and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Blvd. and Military Road S. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Continued preparation of figures for property owner outreach
- 30% Plans submitted on October 13

S. 166th Street Sidewalk Project

This Safe Routes to School Program grant funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk and radar speed feedback signs. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Work on NEPA permit is ongoing
- Topographic survey is complete
- A public meeting was held on October 25 at McMicken Heights Elementary School. It was well attended by 25 residents and staff. Staff received and is compiling valuable information shared by residents that will help guide the design of the project. A second public meeting is planned as the design progresses to 60% to follow up with the community. 2018 Overlay Project

This project will reconstruct Military Road S. between S. 209th Street and the I-5 bridge. Work will include “rubbelization” of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, roadway channelization, and permanent signing.

- The design contract has been fully executed and survey has begun

S. 200th Street/26th Avenue Intersection Project

The scope of this project includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at S. 200th Street and 26th Avenue S., installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, pedestrian signal upgrades, signal loop detectors and channelization.

- The professional services contract with KPG has been executed.
- Preliminary design is underway.

Public Works Project Updates Continued

Pavement Condition Survey

IMS Infrastructure Management Services LLC will be conducting a detailed inventory and condition rating of all city streets beginning October 16. The survey is scheduled to be complete by November 24.

Notice of Traffic Pattern Change – S. 176th Street East of International Boulevard

Next week, traffic curb will be installed along the centerline between the eastbound and westbound lanes of S.176th Street from International Boulevard to approximately 150 feet to the east beyond the entrance of the Airport Light Rail Station short-term parking lot. The curb is being installed to address a history of reported near miss collisions due to the current roadway configuration allowing for unsafe left turns from eastbound S.176th Street into the parking lot. The installation of the traffic curb will require the parking lot to be accessed from westbound S. 176th Street. Unsettling Indecent Exposure and Stalking Arrest

On Friday October 20, two students from Chinook Middle School reported to the School Resource Officer (SRO) that a man had been watching them from a vehicle and following them as they walked to and from school. He had exposed himself to them on more than one occasion. They provided a license plate number and positively identified the registered owner of the vehicle. On Wednesday October 25, SeaTac Detectives conducting surveillance in an attempt to catch him, saw the suspect return to the location that had been described, near McMicken Elementary School. The man was arrested and booked for three counts of Indecent Exposure and two counts of Stalking/Harassment. Evidence located at the time of arrest indicated that he was preparing to engage in similar activity as described by the victims.

Recovery of Occupied Stolen Vehicle Leads to Locker Thief

For almost a year, a ring of thieves has plagued local pools and gyms, favoring the opportunity to break into lockers while patrons were exercising. The SeaTac YMCA was hit by the ring, most of which have been taken into custody one at a time and for a variety of crimes. A female remained on the list of people who were wanted for these crimes.

At about 9:30 PM on October 25, a SeaTac Deputy located and stopped a stolen car in the area of S. 130th/27th Avenue S. It was driven by the female we've been looking for, associated with the locker thefts. The car was described by officers as being "packed with mail", gift cards, debit cards, membership cards, purses, make-up bags and wallets. Also located in the car were bolt cutters, screw drivers and other evidence of heroin and marijuana use.
