

Ecology Offers Regional Stormwater Grants to SeaTac and its Grant Partners

The City is excited to announce that two competitive stormwater grants from the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) have been offered to SeaTac and its grant partners totaling over \$297,000. Both grants ranked very high (one and two respectively) on the list of grants awarded to municipalities, allowing us to utilize approximately 35% of the total \$842,114 in funding offered in the 2017 to 2019 grant period.



The first grant for \$152,273 is a joint proposal developed by the City of Burien and its grant partners (SeaTac, Des Moines, and Normandy Park) to create a two-day stormwater and environmental education event scheduled the Spring of 2018 and 2019 in Des Moines Creek Park. The event known as Stormfest will be targeted at Highline School District elementary school students and is intended to be a model for other agencies planning to hold similar events in their jurisdictions.

The second grant for \$155,252 is a joint proposal developed by the City and the Washington Stormwater Center to hold the 2019 Municipal Stormwater Conference, known as 2019 Municon here in SeaTac at one of the local hotel convention facilities. This will be the 3rd Annual Municon, where jurisdictions come together to share research, methodologies, tools and strategies for meeting the components of the Washington State Municipal Stormwater Permits required under federal Clean Water Act. The City expects that this event will have a positive impact on local hotel and restaurants revenue during the event.

While the City and its grant partners have received award offers, there are several steps that have to be addressed before we can begin to implement the grants including grant contract negotiation and City Council acceptance of the grant offer. Both grants were applied for through Ecology's Grants of Regional and Statewide Significance program and have no matching funding requirements.

SeaTac Environmental Grant Recipients

On Wednesday November 1, the Port of Seattle awarded the first grants under the new Airport Community Ecology (ACE) Fund Small Matching Grants Program to support environmental projects and programs in the cities of Burien, Des Moines and SeaTac. Over \$85,000 was awarded to 11 projects who applied for funding in these cities. The next grant cycle will begin in January 2018 with awards to be distributed in the spring. A big congratulations to the three award participants that provide community benefit within the SeaTac area.

Beach Heroes, Environmental Science Center all cities (\$10,000)

The grant will sustain program's ability to partner with Highline School District teachers to bring 1,200 students to an education center at Burien's Seahurst Park.

StormFest, Futurewise, all cities (\$10,000)

This program aims at increasing Highline Public Schools students' understanding of stormwater, reduce behaviors contributing to pollution and inspire stewardship long-term by providing hands-on, experiential education.

Neighborhood Heritage Garden, Highline Botanical Garden Foundation, SeaTac (\$10,000) Grant funds will support the development of a neighborhood history research project that will inform the design of the new Neighborhood Heritage Garden.





Public Works Project Updates

12th Place and 13th Avenue S. Overlay Project

The scope of this project includes pavement repair, asphalt paving and stormwater improvements on 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. between S. 200th Street and S. 207th Street and S. 207th Street between 12th Place S. and 14th Avenue S. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits.

- 100% plans, specifications and estimate are being prepared
- Construction is planned for March/April 2018

S. 168th Street Stormwater System Improvements

- · Stormwater facility installation is complete, paving and property restoration is underway
- Work should be substantially complete by next week

ADA (American Disability Act) Transition Plan

- Data collection is complete.
- A public meeting is scheduled on November 9, 6:00 PM in the Council Chambers

Permit Parking Program

- Draft "Best Management Practices" document and matrix of proposed treatments is complete and is being reviewed internally
- Project selection process is ongoing

Military Road and S. 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of buffered bike lanes; curb and gutter; sidewalks; new pavement; installation of street lighting; upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings; construction of a right turn lane on eastbound S. 152nd Street; and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Blvd. and Military Road S. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

 Continued preparation of figures for property owner outreach 30% Plans submitted on October 13 and are under review by City staff Project coordination meeting scheduled on November 6

S. 166th Street Sidewalk Project

This Safe Routes to School Program grant funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk and radar speed feedback signs. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Draft NEPA documentation is complete and under internal review
- A public meeting was held on October 25
- Refining concept to develop plans

2018 Overlay Project

This project will reconstruct Military Road S. between S. 209th Street and the I-5 bridge. Work will include "rubbelization" of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, roadway channelization, and permanent signing.

The design contract has been fully executed and survey is nearly complete

S. 200th Street/26th Avenue Intersection Project

The scope of this project includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at S. 200th Street and 26th Avenue S., installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, pedestrian signal upgrades, signal loop detectors and channelization.

The design contract with KPG has been fully executed and survey is nearly complete

Pavement Condition Survey

IMS Infrastructure Management Services LLC will be conducting a detailed inventory and condition rating of all city streets beginning October 16. The survey is scheduled to be complete by November 24.

Motel Contact Leads to Felon with Handgun

On November 2 at about 2:30 AM Officer Atterbury, patrolling the motel parking lot in the area of S. 188th Street/Military Road S. saw an occupied vehicle, parked with no motel parking pass. The Officer contacted the nervous occupants and learned that the passenger in the driver's seat had two felony warrants and one misdemeanor warrant. The resulting investigation led to the seizure of a handgun which is believed to be stolen, as the serial numbers had been filed down. The driver was arrested for the outstanding warrants. Charges for illegal possession of a firearm by a felon are pending further investigation.
