Interlocal Agreement with Port of Seattle

The proposed 2018 Interlocal Agreement (ILA) between the City and the Port of Seattle was released today for public comment. The document, press release and other information is now available on the City's website. A brief introductory presentation on the proposed ILA will be made at the City Council Study Session on Tuesday, November 14 at 5:00 PM. An Open House, jointly hosted by the Port and the City will be held at the SeaTac Community Center on Thursday, November 16 from 4:30 to 7:30 PM and will provide another opportunity to learn about the proposed agreement. The City Council and Port Commission are currently scheduled to review the proposed ILA at their respective meetings on November 14 and 28, and on December 12.

Public Works Project Updates

12th Place and 13th Avenue S. Overlay Project

The scope of this project includes pavement repair, asphalt paving and stormwater improvements on 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. between S. 200th Street and S. 207th Street and S. 207th Street between 12th Place S. and 14th Avenue S. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits.

- 100% plans, specifications and estimate are being prepared
- Construction is planned for March/April 2018

S. 168th Street Stormwater System Improvements

Paving and stormwater facility installation is complete, property restoration is ongoing

ADA (American Disability Act) Transition Plan

- Data collection is complete and the draft plan is being developed
- A public meeting is scheduled on February 1, 6:00 PM in the Council Chambers

Permit Parking Program

- Draft "Best Management Practices" document and matrix of proposed treatments is complete and is being reviewed internally
- Project selection process is ongoing

Military Road and S. 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of buffered bike lanes; curb and gutter; sidewalks; new pavement; installation of street lighting; upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings; construction of a right turn lane on eastbound S. 152nd Street; and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Blvd. and Military Road S. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Continued preparation of figures for property owner outreach
- Development 60% plans is beginning
- Coordination with property owners is underway

S. 166th Street Sidewalk Project

This Safe Routes to School Program grant funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk and radar speed feedback signs. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Draft NEPA documentation is complete and under internal review
- A public meeting was held on October 25
- 30% design is in review

2018 Overlay Project

This project will reconstruct Military Road S. between S. 209th Street and the I-5 bridge. Work will include "rubbelization" of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, roadway channelization, and permanent signing.

- A project kickoff meeting is scheduled on November 14
- Survey is complete

S. 200th Street/26th Avenue Intersection Project

The scope of this project includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at S. 200th Street and 26th Avenue S., installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, pedestrian signal upgrades, signal loop detectors and channelization.

- A project kickoff meeting is scheduled on November 14
- Survey is complete

Pavement Condition Survey

IMS Infrastructure Management Services LLC will be conducting a detailed inventory and condition rating of all city streets beginning October 16. The survey is scheduled to be complete by November 24.
