

City Manager's Weekly Update December 8, 2017

Port of Seattle (POS) Stakeholder Advisory Roundtable (StART)

In 2018, the Port of Seattle will launch a new way for the communities of Burien, Des Moines, Federal Way, Normandy Park, SeaTac and Tukwila to engage with Sea-Tac Airport staff, at meetings convened by the airport managing director.

Participants will be able to share information, discuss community concerns and voice feedback on the airport's construction projects, programs and operations. Meetings will allow dialogue on airport activities, will inform decision-making and increase knowledge about the airport and the cities.

Membership will include community members and staff from each city; and representatives from airlines, air cargo and the Port. The Federal Aviation Administration will provide agency expertise.

The two SeaTac community members will be appointed by the Mayor and confirmed by the City Council following the City's Citizen Advisory Committee vacancy process. If you are interested in being considered, please fill out a Citizen Advisory Committee application.

Applications will be accepted until Friday, December 15. The first meetings begin in February. Applications are available on the City's website:

Results from Public Poll in Search for Next City Manager

During the month of October 2017, there was a non-scientific poll available for residents and business owners to give their input on key values, attributes and qualities sought in the next City Manager. The data provided by 62 individuals has been collected and reviewed. You can view the poll results here.

The general results and comments will be used by the City Council as input into the job announcement when the recruitment for the position begins early in 2018. City Manager recruiting documents usually contain much more detailed information about the local community, operation of the local government and expectations of the City Manager than other staff positions. The more specific information that is provided in the announcement will help lead towards applicants more interested in our community rather than just in the job.

Examples include: community preferences about where the next City Manager should reside after hiring (such as in South King County) is important for potential candidates to understand. A community preference for someone who has experience working in public government agencies, or has applicable city manager or private executive management experience can encourage appropriately qualified candidates to apply. Reflecting desired qualities such as being an excellent problem solver, motivated to bring people together, establish goals and work thoughtfully with the City Council to achieve those city goals are important to know up front.

The poll provided the first of the opportunities for the SeaTac community to participate in this important decision facing the Council in 2018. The insight of the residents' and business owners' preferences for their next City Manager is valuable for this decision.

Fire and Police Explorer Appreciation Event

Last Thursday, November 30, the City held its annual appreciation event to recognize the contributions of the Police and Fire Explorer programs. Staff and advisors work diligently throughout the year to teach scouts about the profession and develop leadership skills. Both programs provide support to their respective departments as needed and at community events.



Cruz Silva has been an Explorer Sergeant with the SeaTac Explorers for over a year. SeaTac Chief of Police Lisa Mulligan presented Cruz with the King County Sheriff's Explorer of the Year Award.

Cruz was nominated due to his commitment to the Explorer post and his involvement with the community. He presents open forums with students that attend the Puget Sound Skills Center. His goal is to build bridges between law enforcement and today's youth. It's important to have understanding on both sides, especially with so much turmoil in society. Cruz also attends recruitment events with the King County Sheriff's office. He donates his time to all post events, festivals, meetings and to the Highline Food Bank.





SeaTac Transitions to a New Phone App

The City of SeaTac is transitioning to a new phone app to support our Click-N-Request reporting system established in 2012. The updated phone app has the same branding (Click-N-Request) as our original version, just a different service provider — SeeClickFix. The phone app is designed to allow citizens to report a problem to the City without having to call in or submit an email. While the



new phone app went into effect on November 13 of this year, City staff will announce once all testing has been completed and the integration of the new application is finalized.

The new phone app will be fully operational by mid-December. To help make citizens aware of the transition, existing phone app users were notified via email of the change.. To download the new phone app, citizens can go to their favorite app store, and search for SeeClickFix and download the SeeClickFix app. When this app is operated within the City, the SeaTac Click-N-Request branding will appear on the screen.

Public Works Project Updates

Highline Water District Repair Work - S. 176th Street

Water main repair work by Highline Water District (HWD) is ongoing along S. 176th Street, between Military Road S. and 42nd Avenue S. Traffic is being managed though a single lane closure during construction. Level 3 Utility Work - Military Road S.

Fiber optic installation work by Level 3 is scheduled to start next week along Military Road S., between S. 176th Street and S. 160th Street. The work will occur in the center dual left turn lane and northbound lane through this area. Appropriate traffic control measures and off-duty officers (as required) will be implemented to manage traffic through this work area.

Utility Work - South 188th Street

Utility work for the Hilton Garden Hotel (currently under construction) at 3056 S. 188th Street will begin soon. This work will require lane closures in S. 188th Street east of International Boulevard. Several utilities will need to be installed across S. 188th Street to serve the new hotel. Appropriate notification, traffic control measures, and off-duty officers (as required) will be implemented to manage traffic through this work area.

12th Place and 13th Avenue S. Overlay Project

The scope of this project includes pavement repair, asphalt paving and stormwater improvements on 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. between S. 200th Street and S. 207th Street and S. 207th Street between 12th Place S. and 14th Avenue S. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits.

- 100% plans, specifications and estimate are being prepared
- Construction is planned for March/April 2018

ADA (American Disability Act) Sidewalk Transition Plan

- Data collection is complete and the draft plan is being developed
- A public meeting is scheduled on February 1, 6:00 PM in the Council Chambers

Permit Parking Program

- Review of draft "Best Management Practices" document and matrix of proposed treatments is complete
- Draft to be brought to Public Safety and Justice Committee in January

Military Road and S. 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of buffered bike lanes; curb and gutter; sidewalks; new pavement; installation of street lighting; upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings; construction of a right turn lane on eastbound S. 152nd Street; and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Blvd. and Military Road S. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- · Continued preparation of figures for property owner outreach
- Development 60% plans is underway
- Utility coordination is underway
- Meeting to coordinate with City of Tukwila's Justice Center design held this week

S. 166th Street Sidewalk Project

This Safe Routes to School Program grant funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk and radar speed feedback signs. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Draft NEPA documentation is complete and under review
- Utility coordination is underway
- 60% design is underway

2018 Overlay Project

This project will reconstruct Military Road S. between S. 209th Street and the I-5 bridge. Work will include "rubbelization" of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, roadway channelization, and permanent signing.

- Conceptual alternatives meeting held on December 2
- Geotechnical work has begun

S. 200th Street/26th Avenue Intersection Project

The scope of this project includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at S. 200th Street and 26th Avenue S., installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, pedestrian signal upgrades, signal loop detectors and channelization.

- A project kickoff meeting occurred on November 14
- Preliminary design has begun

Pavement Condition Survey

IMS Infrastructure Management Services LLC has been conducting a detailed inventory and condition rating of all city streets between October 16 and November 24. Data collection is complete and a draft report is being prepared.


