BUSINESS

Agency Presentations

HealthPoint Lisa Yohalem and Maria Tapia shared they've grown to 87,000 patients strong. SeaTac programs include 1,795 healthcare patients or 5,917 visits and 497 dental patients or 1,386 visits. Additional locations are up and down the I-5 corridor. They are open in SeaTac 3 late nights/week and offer natural medicine, behavioral health, a full pharmacy on site, Skyped interpretation services when needed in addition to their primary medical care. 14% of clients are uninsured, 94% have incomes less than \$49.000 for a family of four and the majority of patients are 19-64 years of age. They monitor clinical measures such as diabetes A1c to demonstrate positive outcomes. They use a best practice model – comprehensive whole person care that is culturally and linguistically appropriate when need.

Roxana Pardo Garcia shared about the funding Landscape in SKC including County funding and Private Foundations. She shared that it requires relationship building and tours of sites. She emphasized that city dollars leverage these bigger pots of funds as folks like to see local jurisdictions investing in their residents.

Parks Director, Lawrence Ellis updated the committee on the efforts of the Kone Consulting on the Human Services Needs Assessment sharing they were currently doing listening sessions and would be presenting a draft at the next CSAC.

New Business

Lawrence also shared that he presented to the Administrative and Finance Committee (A&F) on Nov. 2nd regarding agency performance. All agencies are performing at or well above goals so it was recommended that all agencies receive 2nd year funding. A&F agreed.

Colleen shared that WizeHive is working hard to complete the platform for the Common Application platform. YMCA lost some funds so will not be providing their K+ program – SeaTac recreation is looking into providing the program.
