Dedicated fund 105 - Port of Seattle (POS) Interlocal Agreement (ILA) Fund

Acting City Manager Scorcio stated this fund was created in 1998 for the \$10 million in community relief money paid pursuant to the 1997 ILA. The ending fund balance is a 2% decrease from the 2015-2016 budget.

Council discussion ensued regarding restrictions on use of money, use of funds to purchase SeaTac Center, and Botanical Garden expenditure from this fund.

Report and Direction on Additional Review/Analysis from Workshop 3

Acting Finance Director Pilo stated staff is still researching the answers to the following questions raised at Budget Workshop 3: SCORE History, Construction Sales Tax Policy, \$40,000 paid to SeaTac by Valley View Sewer District for sidewalks at South 150th Street, and Human Services expenditure report.
