Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program 2018

Following a major disaster, people rely on each other to save lives and protect property. Services that we rely on may not be available for at least 3 days.

You can make a difference in our community by using the CERT training we offer to save lives and protect property. Be prepared by participating in the 2018 CERT Program. Citizens, local business, industry and school representatives are encouraged to attend.

This basic training in disaster survival and rescue skills is designed to improve the ability of our community to survive until professional responders or other assistance can arrive. The Puget Sound Fire CERT program serves the areas of Kent, Covington, SeaTac/Burien and Fire District 37. You are welcome to attend this training if you live or work in these areas.

The 8-week program provides instruction on disaster preparedness, disaster first aid, triage (rapid medical assessment of injuries), fire safety, search and rescue, disaster psychology and team organization.

This class meets once a week for eight weeks. There are seats still available in the Spring Thursday afternoon session that will meet from 1:00 - 4:30 PM. **Session begins March 8**. 

Public Works Project Updates

Level 3 Utility Work - Military Road S.

Fiber optic installation work by Level 3 started in December and is ongoing along a route that begins at international Blvd at S. 152nd Street and ends at Military Road S. and S. 228th Street. The work is scheduled to be performed at night and will involve accessing existing manholes in the roadway to install new fiber optic cable. Appropriate traffic control measures and off-duty officers (as required) will be implemented to manage traffic through this work area.

Utility Work - South 188th Street

Utility work for the Hilton Garden Hotel (currently under construction) at 3056 S. 188th Street is ongoing. This work will require lane closures in S. 188th Street east of International Boulevard. Several utilities will need to be installed across S. 188th Street to serve the new hotel. Appropriate notification, traffic control measures, and off-duty officers (as required) will be implemented to manage traffic through this work area.

Burien Gateway Project

Right of Way improvements associated with construction in the City of Burien will begin very soon on the west side of Des Moines Memorial South between S. 144th Street and S. 140th Street. The improvements include curb and gutter, sidewalk, a drainage swale, and half street overlay. At times, one lane closures with alternating directions of travel will be in place. Traffic control measures will include signage, flaggers and off duty police officers. Lane closures will be in place only during working hours. This work is anticipated to be completed in June of 2018.

12th Place and 13th Avenue S. Overlay Project

The scope of this project includes pavement repair, asphalt paving and stormwater improvements on 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. between S. 200th Street and S. 207th Street and S. 207th Street between 12th Place S. and 14th Avenue S. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits.

- 100% plans, specifications and estimate are being prepared
- Interlocal Agreement with Highline Water District will be reviewed at the City Council Study Session on February 27 and placed on the consent agenda for the March 13 Regular Council Meeting
- Project will advertise on March 7 and the bid opening will be held on March 21
- Construction is planned for April 2018

ADA (American Disability Act) Sidewalk Transition Plan

The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan will include a Self-Evaluation Study which identifies barriers within public rights-of-way to persons with disabilities from access (for example, at curb ramps, sidewalks, pedestrian crossings and signals, shared use trails, parking lots, and bus stops).

Final plan, which will incorporate public input, is in development

Permit Parking Program

The purpose of the Permit Parking Program is to evaluate on-street parking in three neighborhoods where parking concerns have been identified, and to implement a program to allow the City to better manage the supply to meet community needs.

The final report with recommended implementation plan was reviewed at the February 27
Council Study Session and placed on the consent agenda for the March 13 Regular Council
Meeting

Military Road and S. 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of buffered bike lanes; curb and gutter; sidewalks; new pavement; installation of street lighting; upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings; construction of a right turn lane on eastbound S. 152nd Street; and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Blvd. and Military Road S. This project was scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018 but has been rescheduled for spring 2019 construction to align with the City of Tukwila's Justice Center development.

- Design of utility undergrounding is underway
- Development of 60% plans is underway

S. 166th Street Sidewalk Project

This Safe Routes to School Program grant funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk and radar speed feedback signs. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Design of 90% plans, specifications and estimates is underway
- A traffic analysis is being performed at the 34th Ave S./ S. 166th Street intersection to consider the establishment of a 4-way stop

2018 Overlay

This project will reconstruct Military Road South between S. 209th Street and the I-5 Bridge. Work will include rubblization of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, roadway channelization, and permanent signing. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

Design of 90% plans, specifications and estimates are underway

S. 200th Street/26th Avenue Intersection Project

The scope of this design project includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at S. 200th Street and 26th Avenue S., installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, pedestrian signal upgrades, signal loop detectors and channelization. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.


Development of 90% plans is underway

Des Moines Memorial Drive and S. 200th Street Intersection Improvement Project

This project will construct left turn lanes at all four legs of the intersection and a right turn lane on the east leg. Sidewalks and bike lanes will be extended to the beginning of the turn pocket transitions or approximately 300-feet in each direction. The existing span wire traffic signal will be replaced with a mast arm system and the street lighting will be upgraded. Curb ramps and pedestrian signals will be upgraded to current ADA and APS standards and the storm drainage system will be reconstructed.

This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2019.

- A consultant selection committee reviewed and scored consultant statements of qualifications and selected Gray & Osborne, Inc. to design the project
- The design contract was reviewed at the City Council Study Session on February 27 and placed on the consent agenda for the March 13 Regular Council Meeting

The King County Sheriff's Office, SeaTac Police, and Burien Police have designed a program to educate residents of their cities about the King County Sheriff's Office. Students will learn about the role of law enforcement officers and the criminal justice system.
