A limited quantity of rain barrels (\$25 cash each) and compost bins (\$20 cash each) are available for purchase.

Bring in your small household items and clothing and their "expert fixers" will try to repair and mend them for free! The first Repair Time Fix-It Event was held August 13, 2016 at Valley Ridge Park, where the group worked on 51 items and fixed or helpfully diagnosed more than 90 percent of them.

Please only bring items small enough to be easily carried in by one person. Do not bring any items that are leaking, dangerous, contain gasoline, or have a strong odor. Clothing and other textiles that are brought in for mending should be washed first.

Please sign up in advance if possible to let the group know what you plan to bring so their fixers can be prepared. For specialized repairs, please bring any specific parts or materials needed for your repair.

You must be present during the repair. There is no assurance an item can be fixed, or that attempting to fix it won't break it even more.

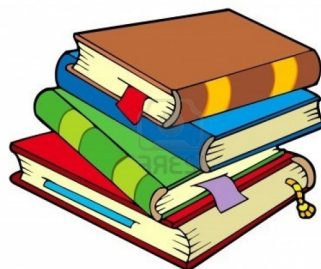

Public Works Project Updates

Level 3 Utility Work – Military Road South

Fiber optic installation work by Level 3 started in December and is ongoing, along a route that begins at International Blvd at S 152nd St and ends at Military Road S and S 228th St. The work is scheduled to be performed at night and on weekends and will involve accessing existing manholes in the roadway to install new fiber optic cable. Some pavement removal will be required to repair damaged conduit. Appropriate traffic control measures and off-duty officers (as required) will be implemented to manage traffic through this work area.

Utility Work – South 188th Street

Utility work for the Hilton Garden Hotel (currently under construction) at 3056 S. 188th St. is ongoing. Work is scheduled for the week of 3/26-3/30. This work will require lane closures in S 188th St east of International Boulevard. Several utilities will need to be installed across S 188th St to serve the new hotel. Appropriate notification, traffic control measures, and off-duty officers (as required) will be implemented to manage traffic through this work area

Burien Gateway Project

Right of Way improvements associated with construction in the City of Burien has begun on the west side of Des Moines Memorial South between South 144th St. and South 140th St. The improvements include curb and gutter, sidewalk, a drainage swale, and half street overlay. At times one lane closures with alternating directions of travel will be in place. Traffic control measures will include signage, flaggers and off duty police officers. Lane closures will be in place only during working hours. This work is anticipated to be completed in June of 2018.

12th Place and 13th Avenue South Overlay Project

The scope of this project includes pavement repair, asphalt paving and stormwater improvements on 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S. between S. 200th Street and S. 207th Street and S. 207th Street between 12th Place S. and 14th Avenue S. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits ahead of the overlay.

- A bid opening will be held on March 21, the apparent low bidder is Kar-Vel Construction, Inc. with a bid of \$1,633,535,60.
- City Council authorized the award of the project to Kar-Vel Construction at the March 27 Council Meeting.
- Construction is planned for April 2018

Permit Parking Program

The purpose of the Permit Parking Program is to evaluate on-street parking in three neighborhoods where parking concerns have been identified, and to implement a program to allow the City to better manage parking in these areas.

- The final report with recommended implementation plan was discussed at the March 13 Regular Council Meeting and was referred back to the Transportation and Public Works Committee to review options.

Military Road and South 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of bike lanes, curb and gutter, sidewalks, new pavement, installation of street lighting, upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings, construction of a right turn lane on eastbound S. 152nd St. and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Blvd. and Military Rd. S. This project was scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018 but has been rescheduled for spring 2019 construction to align with the City of Tukwila's Justice Center development.

- Design of utility undergrounding is ongoing
- Right-of-way acquisition process is underway
- Development of 60% plans is underway

South 166th Street Sidewalk Project

This Safe Routes to School Program grant funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk, pedestrian lighting and radar speed feedback signs. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- Design of 90% plans, specifications and estimates is ongoing
- Right-of-way permit for pole relocations has been issued and relocation work will begin shortly

2018 Overlay

This project will reconstruct Military Road South between S 209th Street and the I-5 bridge. Work will include rubblization of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, roadway channelization, and permanent signing. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- 90% plans, specifications and estimate are complete
- Utility coordination is ongoing

South 200th Street/26th Avenue Intersection Project

The scope of this design project includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at S. 200th St. and 26th Ave. S., installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, pedestrian signal upgrades, signal loop detectors and channelization. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2018.

- 90% plans, specifications and estimate are complete
- Utility coordination is ongoing

Des Moines Memorial Drive and South 200th Street Intersection Improvement Project

This project will construct left turn lanes at all four legs of the intersection and a right turn lane on the east leg. Sidewalks and bike lanes will be extended to the beginning of the turn pocket transitions or approximately 300 feet in each direction. The existing span wire traffic signal will be replaced with a mast arm system and the street lighting will be upgraded. Curb ramps and pedestrian signals will be upgraded to current ADA and APS standards and the storm drainage system will be reconstructed. This project is scheduled for construction in the summer of 2019.

- The survey has begun
- A project kickoff meeting will be scheduled within the next two weeks

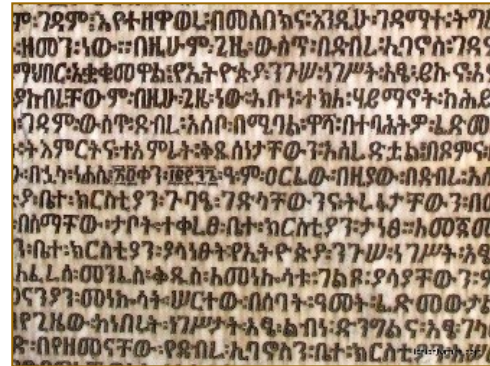
