	 Discussed relevant statistics and trends. Vehicle Trespass, gross misdemeanor discussion Increased traffic of vehicles; proposed motorcycle police with traffic patrols. Halse informed of the improved TNC rematch and improved traffic flows. McCracken commented on Air Cargo Road closures and requested better communication to notify all bus operators of possible closures.
6. City Updates	 Yeremeyev provided updates on: Fund Application Process – Review current application and provide suggestions during the May meeting. Need to discuss tracking of impact of the extra stay criteria, how far in advance to apply and other requirements. Brief discussion of Opportunity Fund – allocating a percentage of the available funding for one day events (shorter events) Councilmember Forschler updated the group about phasing out of Land Use and Parks Committee and replaced it with the Planning and Economic Development (PED) committee. Morgan discussed Master Planning process for the other 5 acres of the garden. The group would like to have the Port of Seattle to provide a presentation on Economic Forecast and Impact Study. The committee also would like to see a Public Works presentation on road improvement plans; Kertzman – mentioned the need to review the budget prior to fund allocation; Councilmember Forschler provided an update on Councilmember Kwon's effort with the Mail Box initiative, who personally helped install 390 mailboxes over about 4 years. This effort is ongoing. Committee members would like to explore expanding the lockable Mail Box program to the neighbor cities who are members of Soundside Alliance.

Other Business	 Kertzman discussed Sports Development Management Position; Seahawks and Seawolves team activity and partnerships and the Starfire Amateur Sports Championship; McGuire provided an update about the Special Olympics, Paddle Board competition. Kristina at SSRTA is looking for volunteers. Halse discussed the Port of Seattle Internship Program which provides mentoring and opportunity to hire these interns. Also mentioned the May 4th
