They informed the committee about Seattle Southside Television channel to be played in the local hotels, promoting Seattle Southside tourism attractions, similar to "Visit Seattle" programming. Currently working on recruiting hotelier "participation". SSRTA will pay out of their budget for this channel; other similar channels are often paid by advertisements. Suggested making the fund application process easier/more streamlined as it is currently "uncomfortable" to ask for allocation, however big or small the amount; mentioned the Highline SeaTac Botanical Garden Master Plan for the development of 5.5 acres is planned for 2018 (aspects named: Public, Community, Staffing needs); Would like to have honest conversations to discuss funding needs/plans Committee discussed potential use of the lodging tax money towards 1-2 day tourism related events Bauknecht mentioned the Vietnam Veterans commemorative park at the Museum of Flight with free admissions. This will likely attract travelers from all over the United States. Kertzman mentioned during last year's HMAC budgeting / fund allocation decisionmaking meeting, the committee members requested an updated detailed financial report prior to hearing or making future funding allocation decisions.
