City Property on the Market

The City is actively marketing the sale of three substantial real estate holdings that when redeveloped will help to continue the on-going positive evolution of our community. The former sites of both Fire Station 45 on South 200th Street and Fire Station 47 on South 152nd Street will be developed into new buildings. Under the current zoning code of the City, these could potentially serve a variety of purposes including housing, services, and retail. The City is also selling the SeaTac Center and other associated parcels on International Boulevard located in the heart of the South 154th Street Station Area across from the light rail station. This property will be redeveloped by the private sector into a mixed-use transit oriented development, with a mix of open space, housing, office, and commercial uses in furtherance of the goals of the station area plan.

Alaska Air Makes Big Investment in SeaTac Office Campus

The first phase of the Copper River Project called, "The Hub," includes a modern 128,000-square-foot office building, a parking structure, and extensive landscaping with walking paths.



ON MAY 3, MAYOR SIEFKES, along with other local and State officials, helped Alaska Air Group break ground for the construction of the first phase of the "Copper River Project" that will become a major part of the company's presence in SeaTac. It is being developed primarily on the location of the former Sandstone Motel and includes several adjacent properties. One of which was acquired from the City as part of the overall assemblage of the 6.8-acre site on International Boulevard and S. 192nd Street. The investment in the real estate was approximately \$32 million.

The first phase of the Copper River Project called, "The Hub," includes a modern 128,000-square-foot office building, a parking structure, and extensive landscaping with walking paths. The site is strategically located between the corporate headquarters and the flight-training center. The Hub will serve many functions including operations and recruiting. The first building will also have a company store open to the public.

There are additional phases planned for the full buildout of the site that could include up to three additional office buildings totaling 512,000-square feet and additional structured parking. ♦

Partnership for Conservation and Growth

Over a two-day period in March, the City facilitated and helped coordinate a project with Habitat for Humanity and Alaska Airlines. The goal of this project was to recycle and preserve most of the furnishings, appliances, and equipment in the former Sandstone Motel. This site will be transformed over the next several years into a new corporate campus for Alaska Airlines called "Project Copper River". Over fifty volunteers representing Habitat for Humanity, AmeriCorps, Alaska Airlines, and the City of SeaTac, removed furniture, mirrors, televisions, lamps, chairs, microwaves, ironing boards, linens, and much more to keep them from



a landfill. All of these salvaged and re-sold materials will help Habitat raise funds to build housing and to furnish the homes of area families. In addition, Alaska Airlines presented Habitat for Humanity with a check for

\$5,000. This community project and the redevelopment of the property, will help build and transform both the neighborhood and the living conditions of hundreds of people. ♦

Did you know that since the year 2000, Port Jobs, a local non-profit organization, served more than 11,000 SeaTac residents and placed over 3,450 of them into jobs at or around the airport through their Airport Jobs center?

In 2017 alone, Airport Jobs served more than 1,000 SeaTac residents and placed 380 of them into more than 475 positions (some people got more than one job). Airport Jobs makes port-related jobs accessible for all local community members.

In 2000, the Airport Jobs center was established at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport. Airport Jobs connects thousands of jobseekers each year with dozens of employers throughout the airport.

AIRPORT JOBS HELP JOB SEEKERS:

- understand what it takes to work at the airport,
- learn about current job openings at Sea-Tac Airport,
- complete employment applications,
- create resumes and cover letters,
- learn job search and interviewing techniques, and
- obtain referrals to community resources.

After getting a job, employees working at or around the airport can take advantage of career pathway educational opportunities that include free onsite college classes through Port Jobs' Airport University and a scholarship program funded by Alaska Airlines.

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Permit Parking Program

AT THE MAY 22 REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING, the final report outlining the City's Permit Parking Program and its recommended pilot project in the McMicken Heights neighborhood was approved by Council. Following approval, staff developed an Ordinance establishing the Permit Parking Program and began procuring equipment and staff to implement the pilot permit parking zone project. Important elements of the project include:

- Permits are only available for residents within the program.
- There is no fee for the first parking permit. However, a \$65 fee for a second parking permit is currently recommended, but will be determined at a later date.
- Residents may apply for parking permits online (further instructions on applying to be distributed to residents) or at City Hall (a computer will be made available).
- All permits will be tied to the resident's license plate number for the respective vehicle.
- Two Limited Commissioned Officers will be handling parking enforcement with the use of license plate reader equipment.
- The scheduled start of issuing permits within the pilot program area is December 2018.



The program is being developed in response to the need to manage increased demand for on-street parking and its related community impacts in SeaTac. This addresses citizen concerns related to on-street parking involving safety, commercial/for-hire vehicle parking in neighborhoods, and littering that has been documented in numerous community meetings since 2013. ♦

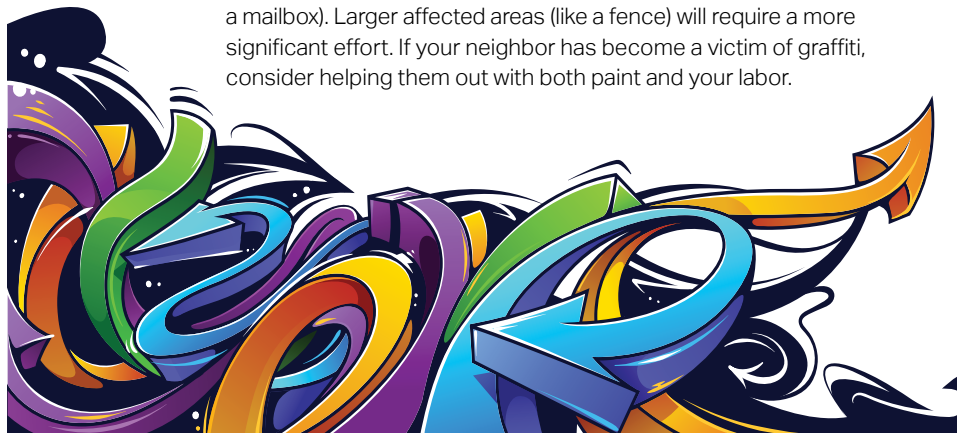
GRAFFITI SHOWING UP AROUND TOWN

Graffiti is unauthorized writing or artwork made on fences or walls in places viewed by the public. Some may be related to gangs who mark their "territory." Areas with graffiti can be perceived as undesirable neighborhoods. Graffiti is becoming an increasingly common reported code violation within the City of SeaTac.

Graffiti is a form of vandalism, defacing public and private properties. Please call 9-1-1 if you see graffiti or "tagging" in progress.

As a reminder, per City Code, the affected property owner is responsible for removing or painting over graffiti on their property. If you have become a victim of graffiti, please do your best to remove it immediately. The Code Compliance program does offer graffiti removal

kits, which work great for cleaning small, smooth surfaces (such as a mailbox). Larger affected areas (like a fence) will require a more significant effort. If your neighbor has become a victim of graffiti, consider helping them out with both paint and your labor.



Curb Marker Program Volunteer Opportunities Available

It is a very common misconception that stormwater is treated before it reaches streams and lakes. Installing stormwater curb markers reminds people that storm drains are for rainwater only. Curb markers are easy to install and are available to volunteer groups from May 1–October 31. For more information contact Stormwater Asset Management Coordinator Jon Kulju at 206.973.4766.

PUBLIC WORKS CONSTRUCTION UPDATES

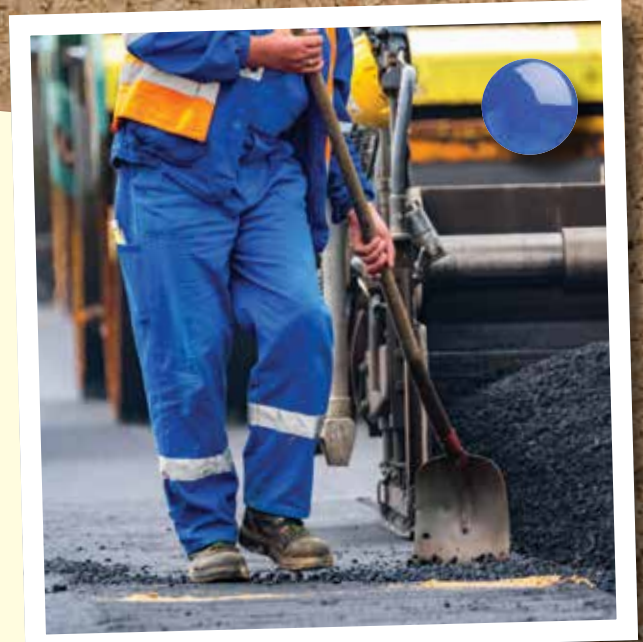
12TH PLACE S. AND 13TH AVENUE S. OVERLAY PROJECT

LOCATION: 12th Place S. and 13th Avenue S.
(from S. 200th Street to S. 207th Street); S. 207th Street
(from 12th Place S. to 14th Avenue S.)

PROJECT DETAILS: This project includes pavement repair, asphalt paving, and stormwater improvements to these roads. Highline Water District will also be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits ahead of the overlay.

PROJECT SCHEDULE: Construction began in late May and will continue through Summer 2018.

IMPACT TO COMMUNITY: Access to these streets will be partially closed during construction activities. Information about the project will be communicated to residents along the project limits several weeks in advance of construction. Project and contact information are available online on the project webpage www.ci.seatac.wa.us/2017overlay.



S. 166TH STREET SIDEWALK PROJECT

LOCATION: S. 166th Street (from
34th Avenue S. to Military Road S.)

PROJECT DETAILS: This Safe Routes to School grant-funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curb and gutter, storm drainage facilities, enhanced crosswalk, pedestrian lighting, and radar speed feedback signs. Construction is scheduled for the summer of 2018.

PROJECT SCHEDULE:
Construction will start in July and be complete in Fall 2018.

2018 OVERLAY PROJECT

LOCATION: Military Road S. between S. 209th Street and the I-5 Bridge Overpass

PROJECT DETAILS: This project will reconstruct Military Road S. between S. 209th Street and the I-5 bridge overpass. Work will include rubblization of the existing concrete road and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, storm water improvements, pedestrian facilities, bicycle lanes, signal upgrades, and permanent signing.

LOCATION: S. 200th Street/26th Avenue S. Intersection Project

PROJECT DETAILS: The scope of work includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at S. 200th Street and 26th Avenue S., installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, and pedestrian signal upgrades.

PROJECT SCHEDULE: Design is scheduled to be complete by May and construction begins in August.



Thinking Naturally: Natural Yard Care Tips

In an effort to protect our natural waterways, the City of SeaTac encourages residents, businesses and property owners to adopt the following techniques:

- Consider shrinking your lawn
- Fertilize moderately with a "natural organic" or "slow-release" fertilizer
- Think twice before using "weed and feed" or other pesticides
- Improve the soil
- Water deeply, not often
- Mow higher (1-2 inches), mow often, and leave the clippings
- Go native

Recycle Right this Summer

LOOKING TO RECYCLE RIGHT? Summertime is a great opportunity to sharpen your recycling skills by following a few simple rules.

■ RULE #1: NO FOOD IN THE RECYCLE BIN

Recyclables should be clean, empty and dry. But how clean is clean enough? Take a yogurt cup or a peanut butter jar, for example. Give these containers a quick rinse and scrape with a spoon or spatula before tossing in the blue bin. This little bit of extra effort helps prevent food scraps from contaminating the rest of the clean materials you spent time sorting!

■ RULE #2: QUICK TIPS FOR IDENTIFYING RECYCLABLE PLASTIC

Don't let the little numbers on the bottom of plastic materials throw you off. Instead, think about your plastics dimensionally. Most 3D plastics can be thrown into the recycle bin (think: milk jugs, laundry detergent bottles, plastic water bottles), while many 2D plastics (think: single plastic shopping bags, chip bags and plastic wrap) go in the garbage.

■ RULE #3: RECYCLABLES SHOULD BE LOOSE

Recyclables should be placed loose in your blue bin. Avoid using black or white plastic bags to contain recyclables to allow Recology drivers and recycling facility employees to clearly identify the contents.

Safety Tips for Your Home

IT TAKES EVERYONE IN OUR COMMUNITY to keep our homes, schools, offices, stores, and other buildings safe. The City of SeaTac Building Division is happy to provide you with the following information to help your family learn more about building safety and the important part building codes and permits play in your everyday life.

What is a building permit? A building permit gives you legal permission to start construction of a building project in accordance with approved drawings and specifications. Building permits are very beneficial to you and your community. By working with an expert code official, you will benefit from their knowledge of the building codes to ensure your construction project is built right, will be safe and will last. Safe construction practices help protect you, your family, your friends and your investment.

WHEN DO I NEED A BUILDING PERMIT? The best way to find out if you need a permit is to call the SeaTac Building Division at 206.973.4750. Staff is there to serve the public by providing information about safety and understanding of our local building codes. Be sure to discuss your plans with a code official before you begin construction to determine whether you need a permit. If a permit is not needed, the building staff will answer your construction questions and provide valuable advice. Permits are usually required for the following:

- New buildings
- Additions (bedrooms, bathrooms, family rooms, etc.)
- Residential work (decks, garages, fences, fireplaces, pools, water heaters, etc.)
- Renovations (garage conversions, basement furnishings, kitchen expansions, re-roofing, etc.)
- Remodeling (new or relocated walls, framing and sheetrock work)
- Electrical, Plumbing and HVAC (heating, ventilating and air-conditioning) systems



WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS OF HAVING A BUILDING PERMIT?

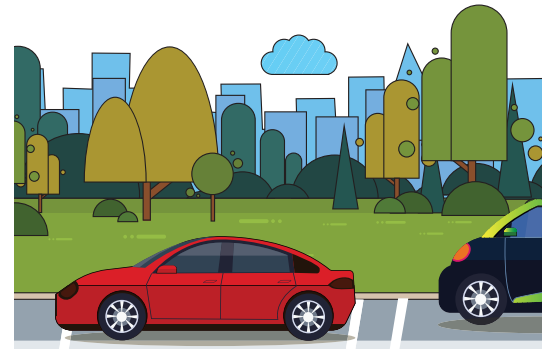
Increases Value. Your home or business is an investment. If your construction project does not comply with the codes adopted by the City, the value of your investment could be reduced. Property insurers may not cover work done without permits and inspections. If you decide to sell a home or building that has had modifications without a permit, you may be required to tear down the addition, leave it unoccupied or do costly repairs.

Protects. A property owner who can show that code requirements were strictly and consistently met, as demonstrated by the City's carefully maintained records, has a strong ally if something happens to trigger a potentially destructive lawsuit.

Ensures Safety. Your permit also allows the code official to protect the public by reducing the potential hazards of unsafe construction and ensuring public health, safety, and welfare. By following code guidelines, your completed project will meet minimum standards of safety and will be less likely to cause injury to you, your family, your friends, or future owners. ♦

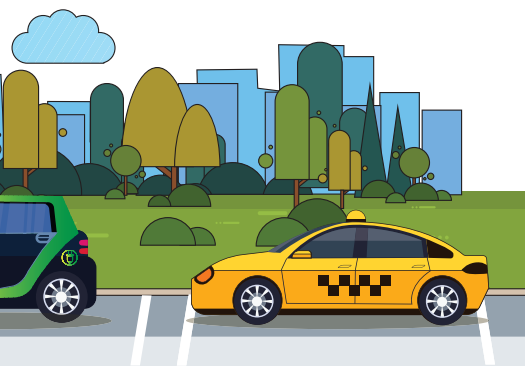

CITY LAUNCHES NEIGHBORHOOD LOCKING MAILBOX PROGRAM

At the March 24 City Council meeting, it became clear that the City has a strong interest in reducing mail theft within our community. At this meeting, City Council adopted an Ordinance providing funding for staff to develop and launch a city-wide neighborhood mailbox replacement program to increase the number of locking mailboxes in our community. This action is being taken to combat the mail theft problem that has increased throughout the Puget Sound region. Consequently, it makes good sense to replace vulnerable non-locking mailboxes with highly secure mailboxes within our community.

This program is available to SeaTac residents and businesses located within the City. Owners of single family residences, duplexes, triplexes, and business property owners that have individual mailboxes are eligible to participate in the program. Tenants may also participate with written permission from their landlord.

The boxes are available at the City's cost of \$108 each, lower than the retail cost of \$159. For those property owners that have incomes below 50 percent of the median (based on the latest HUD Income Guidelines for King County), the cost of the mailbox will be subsidized 50 percent by the City.

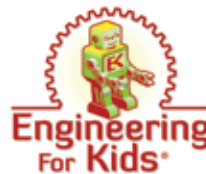

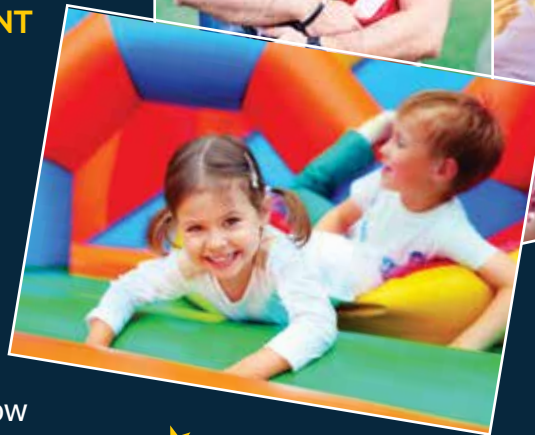
