

City Manager's Weekly Update August 17, 2018

A Warm Welcome to the New SeaTac City Manager



On Tuesday August 14, 2018, the City Council unanimously voted to hire Christopher Dennis as the new SeaTac City Manager. Earlier this month, Dennis was one of four finalist who visited the City for a whirlwind two -day tour that included final interviews with the City Council, a public open house and meetings with City Department Directors and Staff.

The new City Manager will be replacing current City Manager Joseph Scorcio who is retiring at the end of the year after spending nearly six years with the City of SeaTac including time as the Community and Economic Development Director.

The search for a new City Manager began in October of 2017. Since the process began, SeaTac conducted a national search that led to an initial 43 candidates. In mid-July, the City Council interviewed the top candidates and narrowed the list to a final four.

The City has begun employment contract negotiations with Dennis who is expected to start with the City in October. This start date will allow for a transition time that overlaps with the current City Manager.

Christopher J. Dennis is a senior executive having recently retired from the U.S. Navy at the rank of Captain. Chris is from New Smyrna Beach, Fla, is a graduate of Auburn University, and has a Master of Arts in National Security and Strategic Studies from the U.S. Naval War College.

Highlighting nearly three decades of afloat and ashore service, Chris served as the Commanding Officer of: Naval Air Station Sigonella, Sicily, Italy; Helicopter Anti-Submarine Squadron Light FOUR SIX; and the University of Michigan Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps.


Sea-Tac Airport South Entrance at 182nd Street Reopens to Traffic


On Thursday morning August 16, the Port of Seattle reopened Sea-Tac Airport South Entrance at 182nd Street to traffic after closing it for two weeks. A broken water main forced unscheduled road repairs along a small stretch of northbound exit roadway. The closure caused additional congestion on airport drives and SeaTac surface streets.

Roadway Rubblization Planned

The City has begun construction improvements on Military Road South – from South 209th Street to the I-5 overpass. Work will consist of rubblizing the existing concrete road and overlaying it with asphalt. The rubblization process reduces the impact to traffic by establishing the roadway base in a faster and more efficient manner. Click here to see a short video of how the process works.

Councilmember Peter Kwon Appointed to 4Culture Board



Congratulations to Councilmember Peter Kwon who King County Council just appointed to the 4Culture Board. The Council made a unanimous decision to have Councilmember Kwon serve as Board Position 1 for the remainder of a three-year term, set to expire on December 31, 2020. 4Culture is governed by a 15-member Board of Directors.

4Culture uses Lodging Tax and 1% for Art funds to support a diverse array of cultural experiences from museum collections to theater productions to artists showing work in galleries.

The King County Council chose Councilmember Kwon because of his advocacy work for the arts in south King County including spear-heading the creation of the "Art, Culture, and Library Advisory Committee" and as a member of the Highline Historical Society, and the Highline Botanical Garden.



South 133rd Street Natural Gas Main Replacement Project

In an ongoing effort to deliver safe and reliable energy to SeaTac-area customers, Puget Sound Energy (PSE) will be working on the natural gas system in your neighborhood. The work requires PSE to replace the existing underground natural gas main with corrosion-resistant plastic main. PSE is committed to completing the project safely and efficiently, and its crews will do their best to reduce impacts to nearby neighbors. Please see below for project details.

Work Details

Who: Natural gas crews from PSE and InfraSource.

What: Replacing the underground natural gas main as well as selected individual natural gas services.

When: Work is expected to begin in late August and last approximately three weeks. Work hours: Monday through Friday,

8:00 AM-4:00 PM.

Where: A portion of South 133rd Street,

SeaTac.

Sewer Safety

If the project involves being underground near your sewer or septic lines, PSE will conduct a follow-up inspection of your lines by inserting a camera through them. Although installers take care to avoid sewer and septic lines, on rare occasions, a gas pipeline is inadvertently installed through those lines, which are often not mapped or detectable using above-ground sensors. This inspection verifies your sewer is clear of a gas line. Visit their website for information about PSE's work with Hydromax USA to prevent cross bore danger.

What You Can Expect

Signs and traffic control flaggers will guide vehicles through the work zone. There will likely be noise from trucks and heavy machinery during work hours. Some customers may experience a short interruption of natural gas service during this time. PSE will notify impacted customers prior to beginning work requiring an interruption in service. After gas main construction is complete, you will notice a temporary patch in the road and/or sidewalk. This temporary patch will remain until a contractor crew from AA Asphalting, Inc. returns to complete the final road and/or sidewalk restoration. The restoration schedule is dependent upon weather, permitting, and crew availability. This work should not impact electric service in the area.

Port Announces Public Meetings Regarding Environmental Review of Sea-Tac Sustainable Airport Master Plan

Utility Work - South 188th Street

Utility work to service the new Hilton Garden Hotel (currently under construction) at 3056 South 188th Street is ongoing. This work will require lane closures on South 188th Street east of International Boulevard. Appropriate notification, traffic control measures, and off-duty officers (as required) are being used to manage traffic through this work area. **Paving is scheduled for early September**.

12th Place and 13th Avenue South Overlay Project

The scope of this project includes pavement repair, asphalt paving, and stormwater improvements on 12th Place South and 13th Avenue South between South 200th Street and South 207th Street, and South 207th Street between 12th Place South and 14th Avenue South. Highline Water District (HWD) will be replacing all of their water lines and services within the project limits ahead of the overlay. **Construction will last through the summer.**

South 166th Street "Safe Routes to School" Project

This "Safe Routes to School" grant-funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curbs and gutters, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk, pedestrian lighting, and radar speed feedback signs. **Construction will begin early September.**

Military Road South between South 209th Street and the I-5 Bridge, South 200th Street, and 26th Avenue Intersection

This project will reconstruct Military Road South between South 209th Street and the I-5 Bridge. Work will include rubblization of the existing concrete road in place and overlaying with hot mix asphalt, construction of storm water improvements, addition of pedestrian facilities and bicycle lanes, and signal upgrades. This project also includes the grind and overlay of the intersection at South 200th Street and 26th Avenue South, installation of ADA compliant sidewalks and ramps, pedestrian signal upgrades, and signal loop detectors. **Construction has begun. Expect delays daily between 7:00 AM and 4:00 PM.**

Private Development

We have three major private development projects in stages of construction at the current time.

- Expect traffic impacts on northbound International Boulevard at South 173rd Street as crews work on the Hyatt Place Hotel starting the week of August 20, 2018.
- Traffic impacts will continue on 29th Avenue South at the Vintage Retirement Homes.
- Two new projects have begun on southbound International Boulevard near South 190th Street.
 These projects include work on the Copper River project and the Wingate Hotel. These projects will have minimal traffic impacts.
