1. Call to Order	Meeting was called to order at 4:00 PM by Chair Clyde Hill.		
2. Public Comment	Roger Kadeg spoke regarding the study of arsenic and lead levels in Angle Lake. He has concerns about the levels and he provided a handout.		
3. Recommendation of Human Services funding allocations for 2019/2020	 Kim Cooper reviewed the questions posed at the August Parks and Recreation Committee meeting. The Council discussed and came to the following recommendations: Somali Youth & Family Services – Had some concerns regarding the stability of the organization due to having a new director. The Parks & Recreation Committee recommends to reduce the funding from \$25,200 to \$20,000. YMCA – Numbers were brought back to the Committee for clarification from the YMCA. The Parks & Recreation Committee recommends not to fund. Southwest Youth & Family Services – The Parks & Recreation Committee recommends to fund \$20,000. Office of Port Jobs – Get more information before the City Council budget workshop. Leave at zero funding until then. 		

		West African Community Council – Staff will verify that their program is in SeaTac schools. Need more data to determine funding.
4.	Update on Tub Lake	Lawrence Ellis and Anita Woodmass gave an update on what was discovered in a review of correspondence, studies and the next steps to develop a trail system in North SeaTac Park. A Decision Card will go before the City Council as part of the budget process.
5.	Review of the study regarding arsenic and lead levels in Angle Lake	Due to time constraints, this topic was delayed until the October meeting.
6.	Update on S. 188th St. Fence Beautification including cost estimate	Lawrence shared a cost estimate from Commercial Fence Corporation for a black vinyl, chain link fence with black privacy slats. The cost is approximately \$30,000 plus sales tax. He believes this will provide a nice, clean look along S. 188 th St. The Parks & Recreation Committee agrees to go with Lawrence's recommendation.
