


City Manager's Weekly Update March 1, 2019

Sustainable Airport Master Plan (SAMP) Update

On Tuesday February 26, the Port of Seattle presented an overview of the of the Sustainable Airport Master Plan (SAMP) Near-Term Projects scoping report which identified common themes, and next steps in the environmental review process.

The Port of Seattle prepared a Sustainable Airport Master Plan (SAMP) to establish a blueprint for changes at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport (Sea-Tac Airport) to meet future demand. The SAMP planning process was completed in 2018 and identified a Long-Term Vision, as well as a set of Near-Term Projects that are planned for construction by 2027. The SAMP Long-Term Vision for Sea-Tac Airport includes projects that are not ripe for environmental review at this time, as they require further study and are not reasonably foreseeable. Before any of the Long-Term Vision projects are implemented, the appropriate environmental review will be conducted.

This <u>Executive Summary</u> summarizes the principal results of the <u>SAMP</u>—the forecasts of aviation activity, facility requirements, alternatives considered, the long-term vision for Airport development, and the projects recommended for implementation in the near term. SMP Periodic Review Public Comment Period and Public Hearing

The City of SeaTac and Washington Dept. of Ecology are accepting comments on a periodic review of the City's shoreline master program (SMP) under RCW 90.58.080(4). The City has prepared draft SMP amendments to keep the SMP current with changes in state law, changes in other City plans and regulations, and other changed local circumstances.

Public comment will be accepted from February 19, 2019 to March 21, 2019 at 5 p.m. An open house and a joint local/state public hearing is set for March 5, 2019 at the SeaTac City Council Chambers at 4800 South 188th Street, SeaTac, WA 98188. The open house will begin at 5:30 p.m. and the public hearing will begin at 6:00 p.m. Send comments to City staff member Jennifer Kester at 4800 South 188th Street, SeaTac, WA 98188 or via email at jkester@seatacwa.gov. Comments sent to the City will be forwarded to the Dept. of Ecology.

Proposed amendments to the City shoreline master program are available for review at http://www.seatacwa.gov/shorelineupdate and the SeaTac Community and Economic Development Department at 4800 South 188th Street, SeaTac, WA 98188.

SeaTac's SMP, a land use plan for local shoreline areas, applies to Angle Lake and 200 feet landward of the lakeshore. SeaTac is updating its SMP to:

- Address recent amendments to state laws and guidance
- Make it easier to navigate for staff and the public
- Ensure consistency with other City plans and regulations

This periodic update of the SMP will not:

- Re-evaluate the ecological baseline of the shoreline
- Extensively assess no net loss criteria other than to ensure that proposed amendments do not result in degradation of the baseline condition



2019 Comprehensive Plan and Development Regulations Amendment Process Underway



The Comprehensive Plan presents the community's vision for how the City should grow and change to meet the demands of a growing region. This biennial amendment process (occurring in odd-numbered years) is an opportunity for community members to propose changes to the Comprehensive Plan. Additionally, in order to maintain consistency between SeaTac's development regulations and the Comprehensive Plan's goals and policies, the City is conducting a concurrent development regulations amendment process.

Information and amendment application packets are available from the Department of Community and Economic Development, or via the Comprehensive Plan web <u>page</u>. The submittal deadline for Comprehensive Plan and Development Regulations amendment applications is Friday, March 29, 2019.



South 200th Street Shared-Use Path

This project includes building a new separated shared-use path along South 200th Street between 12th Place South and the Des Moines Creek Trailhead. The project will provide pedestrian connections to street improvements that will be constructed at the intersection of Des Moines Memorial Drive South and South 200th Street, and a connection to existing pedestrian and bicycle facilities accessing the Angle Lake Light Rail Station.

Des Moines Memorial Drive South and South 200th Street Intersection

Improvements for this intersection include construction of bike lanes, curbs and gutters, sidewalks, new pavement, installation of street lighting, a new traffic signal system with pedestrian crossings, left turn lanes for all approaches, and construction of a right turn lane on westbound South 200th Street. Final design and right-of-way acquisition are currently being worked on.

South 166th Street "Safe Routes to School" Project

This "Safe Routes to School" grant-funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curbs and gutters, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk, pedestrian lighting, and radar speed feedback signs. Construction is ongoing. Crews are currently working on placing concrete sidewalks.

Military Road South and South 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of bike lanes, curbs and gutters, sidewalks, new pavement, installation of street lighting, upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings, construction of a right turn lane on Eastbound South 152nd Street, and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Boulevard and Military Road South. Final design and right-of-way acquisition are currently being worked on. Construction will begin summer of 2019.

2019 Annual Overlay Project - Des Moines Memorial Drive South

This project will overlay Des Moines Memorial Drive South from South 128th Street to South 136th Street. Pavement repair, storm drainage infrastructure, and traffic signal improvements are also included in the scope of work. The project has been advertised for construction bids with construction scheduled for later this spring.

Private Development

Expect traffic impacts and lane closures on northbound International Boulevard at South 173rd Street as work continues on the Hyatt Place Hotel.

Traffic impacts are continuing on 29th Avenue South as construction continues at the Vintage Retirement Homes.

Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program 2019

Following a major disaster, people rely on each other to save lives and protect property. Services that we rely on may not be available for at least three days.

You can make a difference in our community by using the CERT training we offer to save lives and protect property. Be prepared by participating in the 2019 CERT Program. Citizens, along with local business, industry, and school representatives are encouraged to attend.



This basic training in disaster survival and rescue skills is designed to improve the ability of our community to survive until professional responders or other assistance can arrive. The Puget Sound Fire CERT program serves the areas of SeaTac, Burien, Kent, Covington, and Fire District 37. You are welcome to attend this training if you live or work in these areas.

The eight-week program provides instruction on disaster preparedness, disaster first aid, triage (rapid medical assessment of injuries), fire safety, search and rescue, disaster psychology, and team organization.

This class meets once a week for eight weeks. There are seats still available in the Spring session, which begins on March 5, 2019, and will meet every Tuesday from 1:00 PM to 4:30 PM.
