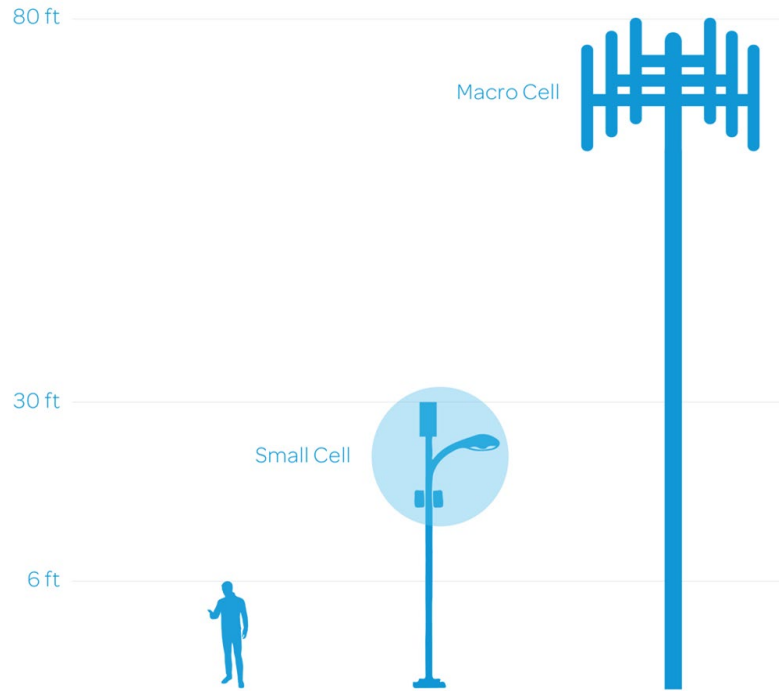

What are Interim Regulations?

- Temporary to respond to emerging issues quickly.
 - Last for six months, with extensions available.
 - Require public hearing within 60 days.
 - Effective immediately with a declaration of emergency and a majority plus one affirmative vote of Council.
 - Will expire unless superseded by permanent regulations.

Why Interim Small Wireless Code?

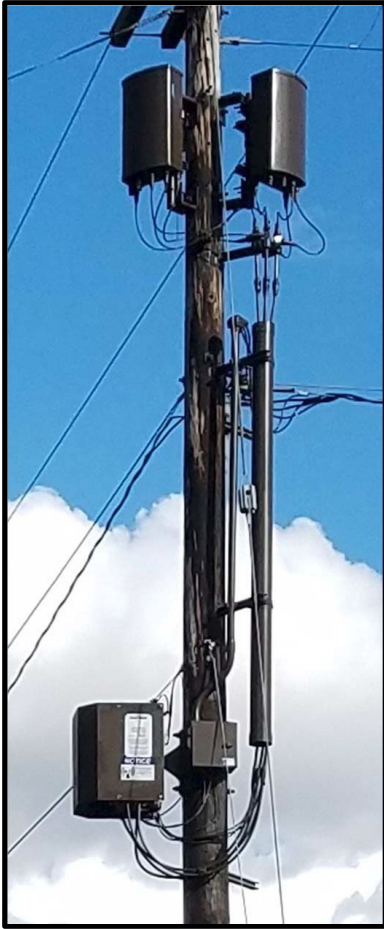


This slide depicts a graphical representation of small cells and macro cells. The actual equipment, size and design may vary.

- 9/26/18: Federal Communication Commission (FCC) issued rules on small wireless facilities, go into effect 1/14/19.
- Three current small wireless franchise agreements with Verizon, Mobilitie, and AT&T.

Impact of FCC Ruling

- Shortens time to process franchise agreements and right-of-way use permits.
- Limits application fees.
- Only reasonable costs directly related to maintaining the ROW and the small cell facility may be charged.
- Limits design requirements to those that are reasonable and comparable to other ROW users, must be published in advance.

Model Set of Interim Regulations

- Consistent design and installation standards for ROW and private property.
- Uniform application requirements for all carriers.
- Allows City to meet federal permit timeframes.
- Consistent with existing franchise agreements.
