Dear Mayor, Councilmembers, Residents, and Employees:

Life Saving Award: On December 29, 2010, SeaTac Police Officer Eric Lewis was at his home when a neighbor was frantically knocking on his door. The neighbor told Officer Lewis that their four year old granddaughter had a seizure and was not breathing. Officer Lewis ran to their house and found the child unconscious and unresponsive. She was pale and her lips had turned blue. No one at the house knew how to treat the child. Officer Lewis immediately began providing aid. He determined she had a weak pulse and was not breathing. He found her airway was obstructed by her tongue and mucus. He was able to get her airway cleared by removing the obstruction. She immediately began to breathe on her own and color returned to her face and lips. Medics arrived and relieved Officer Lewis. The little girl was transported to the hospital.

The next day, the neighbors came over to thank him for his extraordinary actions. They presented him with a card and a lot of hugs. The four year old was back home and doing fine. It turns out that she had a seizure due to a fever and the seizure is what caused her airway to become obstructed. If not for Officer Lewis' quick reaction to a neighbor in need, the child would have likely suffered brain damage or death due to lack of oxygen.

Officer Lewis will be receiving a "Life Saving Award" at the Regular Council Meeting on January 11, 2011 at SeaTac City Hall in the Council Chambers located at 4800 S. 188th Street.

Tennis Outreach Programs (TOPs) Update: Tennis Outreach Programs (TOPs) is a non-profit business in the state of Washington. TOPs provides affordable tennis programs to youth in the community and uses tennis as a way to help underserved and at risk youth in King County by integrating tennis and education.

TOPs is currently working to plan and develop a new indoor multi-use tennis and learning facility and is very happy to report that they received good news from King County Councilmembers Larry Phillips and Julia Patterson. King County was able to put \$100,000 in the 2011 budget to do a feasibility study on helping TOPs with the SeaTac Valley Ridge Park twelve indoor tennis court project. TOPs is very grateful and excited that King County thought the SeaTac project was important enough to fund a study in these exceptionally difficult

economic times. TOPs is looking forward to working with King County and the City of SeaTac over the next few months. King County Parks Director Kevin Brown will complete the feasibility study. He met with TOPs a few weeks ago and said they would begin their work in January 2011 and the report is due April 1, 2011.

TOPs continues to hope that King County will help them obtain financing for the SeaTac project. Private investment financing options are also being looked at by TOPs. However, at this time potential investors continue to be very cautious with financial investments.

Salt Brine added to City's Winter Road Maintenance Toolkit: During previous winter seasons, road maintenance crews spread sand to provide traction on compact snow and ice. The Public Works Department found limitations to sanding which included limited traction benefit, lack of melting capability and costly clean up of storm drainage facilities and street sweeping the following spring.

This winter season, maintenance crews began utilizing salt brine to more efficiently return roads to bare pavement. Mixing tanks, pumps and instrumentation were purchased and assembled in 2010 to add salt brine to winter road maintenance capabilities. The new equipment can mix brine at the rate of 1,000 gallons per hour.

Salt brine contains approximately 23% salt by weight and is applied at a rate of 80% less than traditional solid rock salt. It is an effective anti-icing agent when applied in anticipation of freezing precipitation. The salt brine prevents bonding between snow/ice and the pavement which results in more effective plowing operations and less likelihood of black ice conditions.

Prior to the New Year holiday weekend, crews applied approximately 4,100 gallons of salt brine to the City's priority snow routes which prevented black ice conditions during the weekend. The new approach was so effective that no requests for call-outs were received for the entire holiday weekend.


