CALL TO ORDER: The Arts, Culture & Library Advisory Committee meeting was called to order at 5:34p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Minutes dated February 13, 2019 were approved as written.

DISCUSSION OF SCOPE OF SERVICE DOCUMENT

Brian updated the Committee that the draft was not completed. He did anticipate it being done prior to the April meeting and would send out the draft when it was completed.

LINK THE WORLD EVENT

The Committee discussed their role at the June 29th Link the World Event. Their primary job will be recruiting the artists. It was agreed that all items had to be self made and that there would be an application process. Applications would be submitted and reviewed at the May ACLAC meeting. We also agreed that items could be sold and that artists could come from the local area and not just from within the City of SeaTac. Brian will create the application and send to the Committee this month.

CREATIVE CONSULTANT

Brian updated the Committee that 4Culture has not made a decision about our proposal with Framework. The decision was due March 8th. Brian will ask 4Culture for an update.

OPEN FORUM:

Brian confirmed that the City did not pursue the totem poles discussed in the February meeting. Tani Rae mentioned an event she attended in Olympia at the Heart Sparkle Players Playback Theatre and the Story Oly. The Committee discussed the possibility of having a story telling event here in SeaTac. Tani Rae is going to check to see if they would be willing to come to a future meeting to discuss further.

Brian updated the Committee that So Won Kim has resigned and we would be filling her position sometime in April.

Jim, via a letter read by Bruce, inquired about whether land owned by the Port in North SeaTac Park could possibly be used as an Artist Village. Brian stated the issues of the different leases at North SeaTac Park, between the Port and the City were an issue that was currently being looked at we could inquire if the Committee wanted to pursue.

Committee members that attended the 4Culture Listening session on March 4th at the SeaTac Community Center said it was fascinating and an interesting night of conversation.

The first Valley View Friends of the Library event was a success. They raised \$438 in profits and received a donation of a 5-volume set of rare books. This is going to be sold and the profits added to the total.

LIBRARY REPORT:

In addition to the Friends of the Library update, Angelina shared that the KCLS is having their annual fund raising gala this Saturday. Tickets are \$250 per person. 'The Public' moving opens April 5th. The upcoming theme for the KCLS in March is Art and Culture.
