SeaTac Elevator Repair

Closes June 17 for 2 months

Elevator access to International Boulevard will close for 2 months, shuttle available

The elevator connecting International Boulevard and the SeaTac/Airport LINK station is in need of major repairs and will close June 17 for 2 months. The stairs will remain open. For those with accessibility needs, a shuttle will run between International Boulevard and S 176 St., and the Arrivals loop of the Airport at door 8.


SeaTac elevator closure and shuttle service between International Boulevard and the Airport.

Where

The elevator connecting International Boulevard and 176 St to the SeaTac/Airport LINK station.



More

- You can catch the shuttle at International Boulevard and 176 St. at the bus stop adjacent to the elevator. Look for the sign and shuttle that says "LINK shuttle to airport". You can also catch the shuttle on the Arrivals loop at door 8 (on level 3).
- ➤ The shuttle will run during the hours of operation for LINK light rail (approximately 5 am – 1:30 am) every 15 minutes.
- For shuttle status updates or stop location information call 360-543-9380
- Priority access to the shuttle will be given to individuals and parties with mobility devices such as wheelchairs, walkers, and crutches, or passengers with disabilities who are unable to navigate stairs.
- The shuttle will be operated fare free.
- Due to ongoing wear and tear, the elevator has reached a point where it needs to be replaced. This will allow for better elevator reliability in the future

Major Traffic Detour on Des Moines Memorial Drive

The City of SeaTac Public Works Department is working to improve Des Moines Memorial Drive South for residents, freight traffic, and commuters by grinding and overlaying new asphalt pavement along the roadway this summer. The construction project will begin on Monday, June 3, and is estimated to be completed by Friday, October 2, 2019.

During the four-month construction period, crews will be shutting down lanes along Des Moines Memorial Drive South between South 128th Street to South 136th Street. Drivers are advised to find alternate routes around the area, as these lane closures will impact drivers who utilize this stretch of roadway.

King County Metro will be closing bus stops located along the affected route during the duration of the project. Stops #50010 and #49400 will remain open.

King County Metro is placing temporary stops near South 128th Street and South 136th Street outside of the construction limits for customers to use during the project. Visit King County Metro's website for additional information.

In addition to the new asphalt pavement, the City will be upgrading the roadways with multiple safety improvements for pedestrians. The City will be installing:

- New curb ramps for wheelchairs and bicyclists
- New pedestrian signals to make it easier for people to cross the street safely
- New push-button crosswalk signals at the intersections to meet current Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) standards
- New traffic detection systems at stoplights in order to alert the signal when cars are waiting, which will improve traffic flow

Additionally, crews will be replacing and upgrading the stormwater infrastructure. New catch basins will be installed along with larger replacement stormwater pipes. A stormwater quality treatment vault will be installed within the existing system. These upgrades will improve stormwater flow and limit the amount of flooding along the roadway during heavy rainfall.

SeaTac Police Officers were dispatched last week to a suspicious occupied vehicle in the North end of the City. When officers arrived they found the vehicle running and the driver asleep inside holding what appeared to be a semi-automatic handgun. The vehicle was determined to have been stolen and used during the course of a rape case in Milton.

Officers barricaded the vehicle with their patrol cars and attempted to call the subject out of the car using their PA system. Instead of complying with Officers' commands, the suspect chose to crash through two

patrol cars, then leave the roadway and travel through a ditch, a fence, a yard, and another fence. When the vehicle came to rest, the suspect got out and ran, leaving the firearm behind.

K9 and Guardian 1 were summoned and a perimeter was set up with the help of SeaTac and Burien officers and detectives.

The suspect was located hiding in a yard waste container several houses away from the location of the stopped vehicle.

Milton Police responded and took possession of the car related to their rape investigation. The suspect was booked on outstanding warrants, possession of a firearm, possession of a stolen vehicle, and evading police.

Sound Transit Light Rail Extension Project Update

Kiewit Construction, Engineering, and Mining Services has been chosen as Sound Transit's Design-Build Contractor for the upcoming Federal Way Light Rail Extension project.

The project is scheduled to begin by the end of the year in the City of SeaTac, extending the Light Rail Guideway from the Angle Lake Station at South 200th Street and International Boulevard to the Federal Way Transit Center.

Project leaders are in the process of selecting a location to house the project team near Federal





Lifeguards On Duty all Summer at Angle Lake

Starting Monday, June 24, Angle Lake Park will have a full team of lifeguards on duty from 12:00 PM to 8:00 PM. Due to a nationwide shortage of lifeguards two summers ago, we were unable to find guards for Angle Lake Park. Last summer, we had them at the park five days a week.

This summer we will have guards every day of the week through September 3 (Labor Day). This will include four guards Monday through Friday and five guards scheduled on Saturdays and Sundays. More guards are available for when the weather is especially hot.

This will significantly increase the safety of swimmers at the park. In addition, there will be a full team of seven lifeguards on duty from 12:00 PM to 8:00 PM for our annual Family 4th of July Celebration.

King County Metro, Sound Transit, and City of Seattle launched a new on-demand shuttle service called <u>Via to Transit</u> that will make it more convenient to take transit in southeast Seattle and Tukwila.

Residents can use the Via app or call 206.258.7739 to hail a ride to and from five Link light rail stations (Mount Baker, Columbia City, Othello, Rainier Beach, and Tukwila International Boulevard) where they can board a bus or a Link train. Payment with an ORCA card is accepted, and will automatically apply as a transfer toward a trip on a bus or train.



South 166th Street "Safe Routes to School" Project

This "Safe Routes to School" grant-funded project includes construction of sidewalks, curbs and gutters, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk, pedestrian lighting, and radar speed feedback signs. Construction is substantially complete. Crews are currently working on final restoration, striping, and installing pedestrian lighting.

Military Road South and South 152nd Street

Improvements for this road reconstruction and safety project include construction of bike lanes, curbs and gutters, sidewalks, new pavement, installation of street lighting, upgraded and interconnected signalization with pedestrian crossings, construction of a right turn lane on Eastbound South 152nd Street, and the elimination of the skewed intersection at Tukwila International Boulevard and Military Road South. On May 14, Johansen Construction Company was awarded the contract to construct this project. Construction is expected to begin in late June 2019.

2019 Annual Overlay Project—Des Moines Memorial Drive South

This project will overlay Des Moines Memorial Drive South from South 128th Street to South 136th Street. Pavement repair, storm drainage infrastructure, and traffic signal improvements are also included in the scope of work. Mile Resources is the contractor for this project. Construction is expected to begin in early June 2019.

Des Moines Memorial Drive South and South 200th Street Intersection

Improvements for this intersection include construction of bike lanes, curbs and gutters, sidewalks, new pavement, installation of street lighting, a new traffic signal system with pedestrian crossings, left turn lanes for all approaches, and construction of a right turn lane on westbound South 200th Street. Final design and right-of-way acquisition are in progress. Advertising for construction bids is tentatively scheduled for early June 2019.


34th Avenue South Project

This "Safe Routes to School" project includes construction of sidewalks, curbs and gutters, storm drainage facilities, installation of an enhanced crosswalk, pedestrian lighting, landscaping, and underground conversion of aerial utilities. Design and right-of-way acquisition are ongoing. Advertising for construction bids for this project is scheduled for December of 2019.

South 200th Street Shared-Use Path

This project includes building a new separated shared-use path along South 200th Street between 12th Place South and the Des Moines Creek Trailhead. The project will provide pedestrian connections to street improvements that will be constructed at the intersection of Des Moines Memorial Drive South and South 200th Street, and a connection to existing pedestrian and bicycle facilities accessing the Angle Lake Light Rail Station. Design and right-of-way acquisition are in progress. Advertising for construction bids for this project is scheduled for December of 2019.
