Reduction in Jury & Witness Costs - Judge Bejarano	Informational UpdateX Recommended for:X Approval Approval with modifications DenialReferred to Judge Bejarano reported the City currently pays potential jurors and witnesses \$20 per day. State law requires courts to pay for these services in the range of \$10 to \$25 per day. Judge Bejarano indicated reducing this allowance would reduce the Court's budget for these two fees and bring it more in line with what the majority of jurisdictions pay. The Committee recommended that the City pay \$20/day if the individual is required to stay to participate in court proceedings, and \$10/day if they show up and then shortly thereafter are released for the day.

Animal Control Update - Annette Louie	X_Informational UpdateRecommended for: Approval Approval with modifications Denial Referred to Captain Annette Louie passed out informational brochures that are currently available to the public at City Hall and other locations on services that are provided by Regional Animal Services of King County. Monthly meetings with the county will continue throughout the remainder of 2010 to discuss statistics, law enforcement coordination, licensing and other issues. In 2011, the meetings will be changed to bi-monthly. Information on animal services has been placed on the SeaTac website with a link to frequently asked questions. King County Animal Control personnel are currently canvassing in SeaTac to	

	raise awareness of pet licensing requirements that will go into effect on October 1. There is currently an amnesty period for licensing that extends through the balance of September and they are trying to get the word out to our citizens about this. This service is being provided at no cost to the City.	
5. National Prescripton Drug Take-Back Day – Annette Louie	X Informational Update Recommended for: Approval Approval Approval with modifications Denial Referred to Captain Annette Louie reported that SeaTac will be participating in a one day prescription drug take-back program sponsored by the Drug Enforcement Administration. The event is scheduled to take place on September 25 during the hours of 10am to 2pm in the lobby area of City Hall. Citizens may remain anonymous and drop off their unused prescription drugs, including narcotics, during the event hours. The drugs will be collected and turned over to the DEA for disposal. Informational flyers have been posted at the community center, library, fire stations and local businesses. A press release was also sent to the local media. The service is at no cost to the City.	
6. SeaTac Crime Statistics - Annette Louie	X Informational Update Recommended for: Approval Approval with modifications Denial Referred to Captain Annette Louie provided an update on the Armenian organized crime case that is currently under investigation by SeaTac Police and the Secret Service. One of the main players involved in scamming over \$2 million from a bank in SeaTac was arrested and gave up the identity of several other individuals that were involved. One individual was an employee of the Department of Licensing who was selling drivers licenses. This individual was also arrested. The investigation is ongoing. Crime statistics covering the months of May, June and July were handed out. There has been an increase in tagging over the past few months in the City, however, auto theft and residential burglaries were down from prior months.
