1. Call to Order	Chair Fernald called the meeting to order at 6:05PM
2. Public Comment	There was no public comment.
3. Review of 10/8/2020 Minutes	<u>X</u> Approval Committee approved the meeting minutes as written.
4. Permit Parking Program	<u>X</u> Discussion – Mason Giem, Public Works Program Coordinator, gave an update to the Committee on the working draft Policy, Procedure and Guidelines for the Permit Parking Program. They are working on outreach programs and other changes because of feedback received from residents. The City Manager may also make recommendations for changes to the Ordinance. Staff will continue to involve the committee with the process. Committee discussed the long process and purpose of the PPP with the desire to not change the original intent of the program. Discussion / Questions followed.
5. Vehicle Trespass Ordinance	<u>X</u> Discussion – Sgt. Dery gave a presentation on the proposed ordinance which can be used as an additional tool for law enforcement to enforce the laws associated with possession of stolen motor vehicles and illegally being in someone else's vehicle. Due to the current legal standard for possession of stolen vehicles it makes it difficult to prosecute that crime. This proposed ordinance would add a new chapter to the SMC (8.05), and would make this a simple misdemeanor with a maximum penalty of 90 days in jail and/or a \$1000 fine. Discussion / Questions followed.

	Committee unanimously agreed to bring forward to full Council.
6. Safeway	<p>X Discussion – Captain Hodgson discussed the abundance of criminal activity at the Safeway. He has been working with corporate and store managers on ways to change the environment and reputation in order to reduce crime. A CPTED evaluation has been conducted with recommendations on ways to make improvements in order to increase security and minimize crime. Additional lighting, adding video cameras, and increasing store security staff has been implemented along with reducing store hours. Hopefully these changes will show reduced calls for service this year.</p> <p>Discussion / Questions followed.</p>

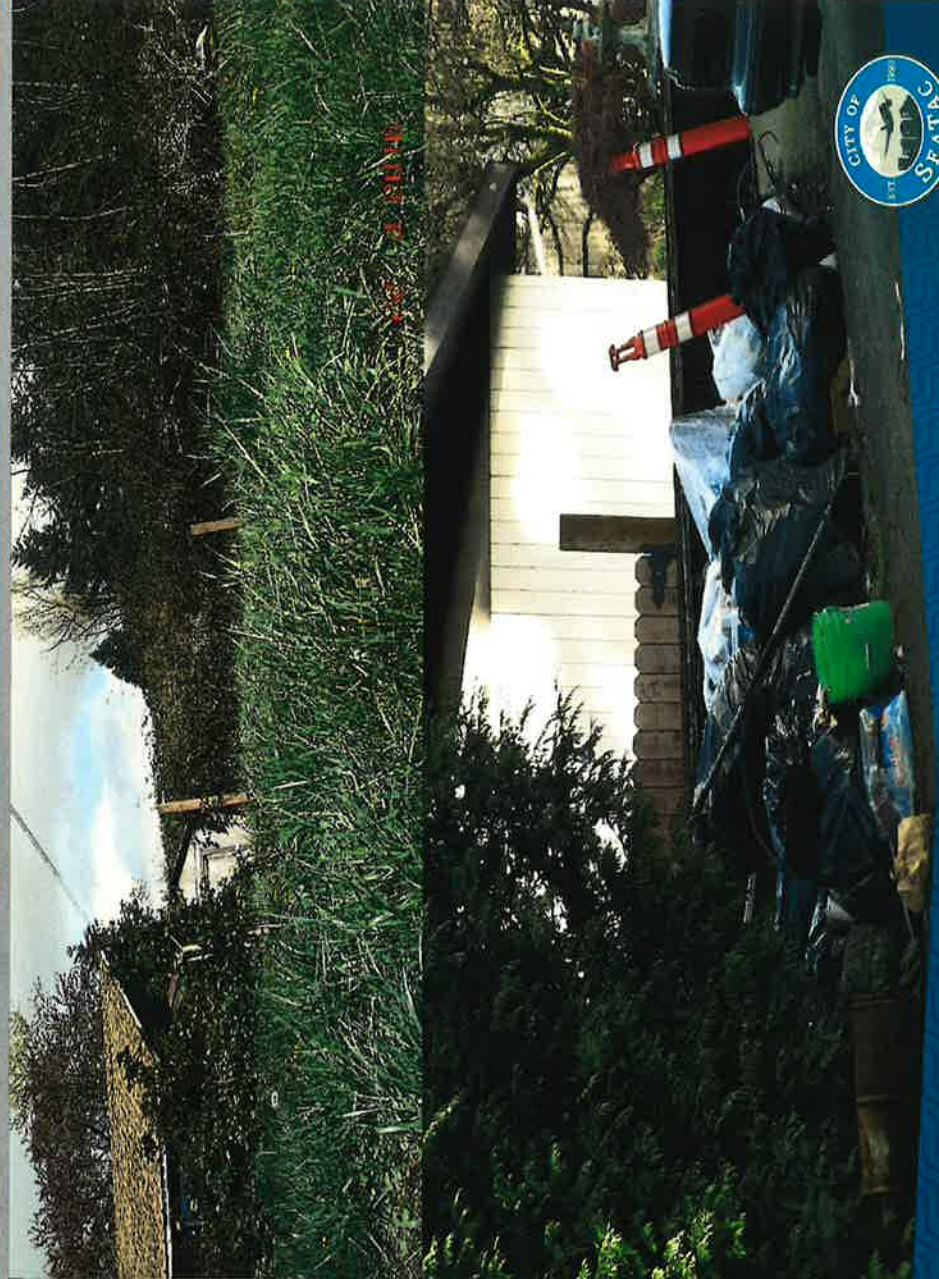

CODE COMPLIANCE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

PURPOSE OF PRESENTATION

Staff to provide a brief overview of the Code Compliance Program as it is currently implemented and to provide discussion ideas for changes to the program.

WHY IS THIS ISSUE IMPORTANT?

1. Code Compliance supports the implementation of neighborhood standards as established in the SeaTac Municipal Code.
2. Code Compliance Program Coordinators are frontline City staff and are part of the City's outreach efforts in the neighborhoods.
3. The way that the Code Compliance Program is conducted influences the way citizens view their City government.

CODE COMPLIANCE

Mission Statement

The City of SeaTac's Code Compliance Team is dedicated to enhancing the quality of life for the citizens of SeaTac by providing effective public service in the enforcement of Building, Business License, Nuisance and Zoning Codes. We are committed to working with both residents and businesses in a professional and effective manner to protect the values and aesthetics of properties and neighborhoods.



CODE COMPLIANCE

- Code compliance activities are carried out by Code Compliance Officers as authorized by SeaTac Municipal Code (SMC) Title 1 Section 1.15.
- Authorization applies to code enforcement actions related to:
 - Business licenses and regulations
 - Solicitors and canvassers
 - Property maintenance
 - Junk vehicles and vehicle storage
 - Garbage
- These violations are pursued under the process outlined in SMC 1.15.045 through SMC 1.15.075



CODE COMPLIANCE

- Code Compliance Officers also investigate violations of:
 - Road standards
 - Right-of-way use
 - Storm water management
 - Buildings and construction
 - Zoning Code violations
- Violations of these City codes are pursued under the process outlined in SMC 1.15.120 through SMC 1.15.160



CODE COMPLIANCE

- Code Compliance is also tasked with enforcement of some provisions of SMC Title 7 Health and Safety:
 - Property Maintenance
 - Junk Vehicles – Vehicle Storage
 - Graffiti Removal
- Other compliance actions are undertaken by different departments or agencies including King County Animal Control and SeaTac Police Department.
- The City of SeaTac website has a complete list of agency referral contact information on the Common Complaint Violations and Referrals page



CODE COMPLIANCE-Enforcement

Two separate but similar enforcement processes:

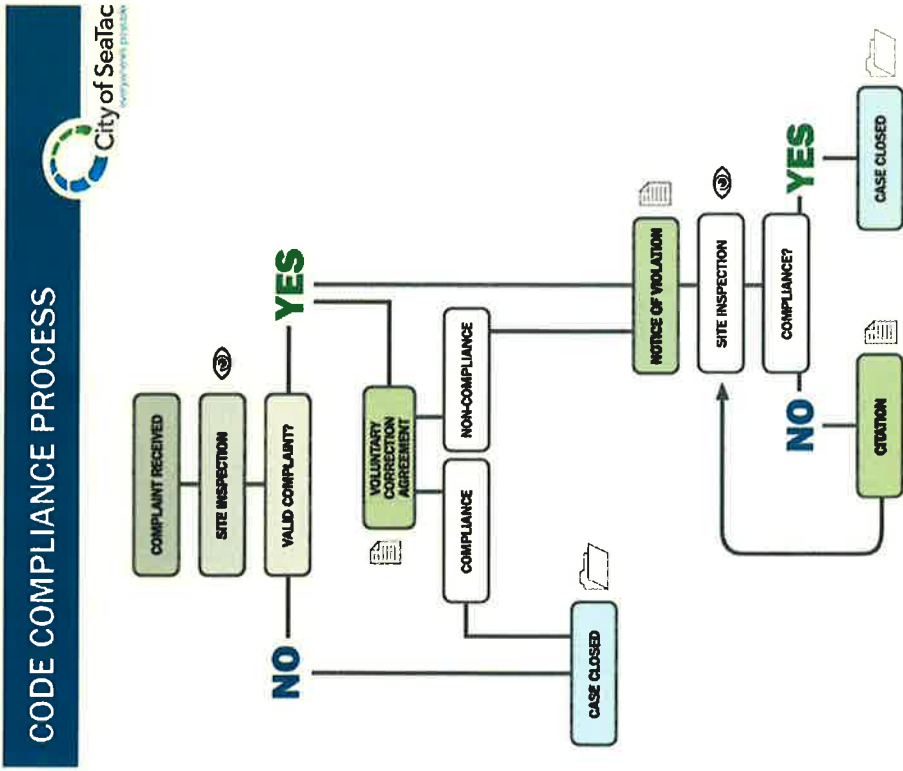
SMC 1.15.045 through SMC 1.15.075 and;

SMC 1.15.120 through SMC 1.15.160

- Both processes require a “first contact” with property owner or person responsible for the property.
 - This contact allows the responsible person to correct the violation within a “reasonable” time
- SMC 1.15.060 allows for a correction agreement whereas SMC 1.15.120 B. requires a formal Notice and Order
 - The first step in a process that escalates the enforcement action to legal action

CODE COMPLIANCE - Enforcement

Process Outcomes

- Most cases resolved after “knock and talk” - initial notification that a violation exists.
- Cases that extend past the knock and talk phase take time and multiple contacts to resolve.
- When an NOV results in a citation or infraction, the case is still unresolved and now in the legal process.
- Code compliance activities do not prevent a reoccurrence of the same violation on the same site.



CODE COMPLIANCE-Enforcement

Top Five Violations

- Garbage
- Overgrown blackberry vines
- Junk cars/Car parts
- Parking on unapproved surface/side yard setbacks
- Graffiti



CODE COMPLIANCE – Enforcement - Reactive vs. Proactive

REACTIVE Program

- The City’s current reactive program:
 - Staff respond to complaints - the City receives complaints on a 24/7 via in person (pre COVID), phone, email, website, and Cityworks;
 - Contact is generally made within 2 working days
 - Violations reported afterhours or on the weekend are addressed during normal business hours
 - Compliance Officers work cases until they have exhausted all options
 - Cases sent for legal action and the court remain unresolved until abatement is ordered by the court



CODE COMPLIANCE – Enforcement - Reactive vs. Proactive

PROACTIVE Program

- Most code compliance programs are largely reactive
- Staff focused on explore and expanding current proactive activities:
 - Graffiti removal program
 - Junk car removal
 - Monitor frequent flyers
 - Referral to social services
 - Coordination with related agencies (e.g. Fire, Police, etc)



CODE COMPLIANCE-Enforcement- Future

Next Steps

- We think we can do more and plan to explore process and program improvements.
- Regular bi-monthly or quarterly updates to PS&J
 - Next update anticipated in April 2021

Subject: **Code Compliance Program**

The purpose of this memo is to provide background information and a brief overview of the presentation on the City of SeaTac Code Compliance program as it is currently structured, and thoughts for potential new program elements. This is an informational briefing and staff is not requesting any specific action from the Committee at this time.

Background

The current Code Compliance program is a CED Division under the supervision of the Building Services Manager. In 2016, Code Compliance was supervised by the CED Planning Manager, then in 2018, for a short time, by the CED director until the division was transferred to the Building Services Manager in 2019.

The program is primarily reactive, meaning that a code compliance action is initiated by a complaint. Complaints originate mostly from private citizens although some complaints come through staff. Complaints are received via Cityworks, a portal where citizens can report a variety of issues on private property or in City ROW. Complaints are also received via a dedicated email (CodeCompliance@seatacwa.gov), a dedicated code compliance phone line, and by completing a Request for Action form available on the City's website. Pre-COVID-19, citizens could also come to the Permit Center lobby to talk to Code Compliance staff.

There are two Code Compliance Program Coordinators who perform field investigations, make direct contact with alleged violators and who follow compliance actions from receipt to resolution. When compliance is not achieved via voluntary compliance by the violator, cases are transferred to the legal system for litigation and abatement.

We are reviewing the current program looking for opportunities to partner with other resources to develop proactive elements that may improve both the timeframe for resolving a case and potential options to help prevent properties becoming compliance cases to begin with. We have begun to explore ways to partner with Human Services and SeaTac Police CSO's to intervene in situations related to mental health and aging in place. We would like to expand our compliance support network to include established nonprofits, like Public Radio's Vehicle Donation Program and Catholic Community Services, and will be surveying neighboring jurisdictions regarding their proactive activities. We are also exploring ways to let neighborhoods know about the City's existing Graffiti Abatement Program Minor Home

Repair Program; and want to encourage them to use these programs before a compliance case needs to be opened.

We hope to continue this discussion regarding Code Compliance over the next year as we are exploring ways to make the program both effective and efficient. We will plan on coming back to the Committee in April to present what we have learned in the first quarter of 2021

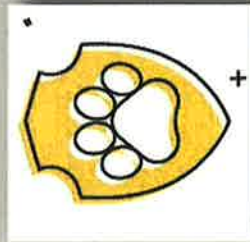

I cat had a microchip, # 98212605866851, which I called and the microchip company, 24 Hour Petwatch called the cat owner and left them a voicemail before giving their information to me.

I looked up the microchip in chameleon and it did not come up as one we had in our system. Once I looked up the name of the owner, Maximus Buguiev in Chameleon, it showed that the microchip in the microchip field there which did not register looking up the # in the microchip field by itself.

The cat owner had reported a lost cat on 09-12-2020. I called their phone number and just asked that they call me back but did not leave the information of how the cat was found. I went to their door to leave a posting and Maximus was home but was only talking to me through the glass window. I let him know I had his cat from the microchip but he was passed and was most likely hit by a car on Military Rd. I noted that he was found 4 miles north so that was quite a distance from home. He came out side and was upset saying I wish you had not come to tell us but it is too late now my wife heard me talking about it. He took the remains and his wife had come out. They were very distraught and crying.

Mr. Buguiev stated that they had put out a bunch of missing cat signs in the neighborhood and had received menacing phone calls from a person stating that they had their cat and were threatening to kill him. Mr. Buguiev said he had made a police report and I asked him to find out the phone number that had called him with the threats. I informed him he should take the remains to a vet for a necropsy and they could determine cause of death. He took my card and will call me with more information.

The offending dog bit his right arm causing one puncture, leaped up and bit him in the chest causing a 2 inch laceration and then went for his knee but did not leave any injury, only a bruise, no picture.

Mr. Ladd then got away towards the office while the female owner secured her dog .
