2. Public Comment	There was no public comment.
3. Review of /2020 Minutes	<u>X</u> Approval Committee approved the meeting minutes as written.
4. Code Compliance Review	<u>X</u> Discussion – Mary Kate gave a presentation of the Code Compliance Program as it's currently implemented and to provide discussion ideas for changes to the program. Evan Maxim explained the priority of responding to code violations as public health and safety, environmental violations, and community character consisting of trash/debris/yard waste. Committee members would like to see more public outreach and education regarding code violations. Discussion / Questions followed.
5. RASKC Review-2020	<u>X</u> Discussion – Tim Ramsaur gave an update on 2020 services provided by RASKC which includes adoptions, pet licenses, animal control response, and shelter care. RASKC provides monthly reports with stats of call responses which are prioritized into six categories, kennel statistics of intakes and outcomes, and a breakdown of activities in SeaTac. Discussion / Questions followed.
6. Vehicle Thefts/Prowls	<u>X</u> Discussion – Chief Mattsen gave a brief overview of stats for Vehicle Prowls and TFA's (Theft from Automobiles) for 2018-2020. Jon explained that typically motel/hotels and parks are targeted and this type of crime moves to different areas of the City. Stats show numbers are down in 2020 due to Covid because

Semi-Parking in the City	<p><u>X</u> Discussion – Chief Mattsen discussed the issue of semi-trucks parking in residential neighborhoods which typically occurs in the north end of SeaTac around S 146th to S 152nd St. off of Military Rd S. If trucks are occupied they are contacted and usually compliant in moving. A better way to address the issue is for residents to call the non-emergency number so response time can be sooner.</p> <p>Discussion / Questions followed.</p>
