<p>Comments: <i>The City's Military Road South Improvements Project has been selected to receive a Washington State Transportation Improvement Board grant in the amount of \$2,950,560.00. The goal of the grant is to promote improved safety and mobility. The project would continue the Military Road South improvements north from South 176<sup>th</sup> Street to South 166<sup>th</sup> Street. In order to provide city matching funds, the Des Moines Memorial Drive and S 200th Intersection and the Int'l Blvd at SR 518 Interchange Improvement projects would be delayed.</i></p>

<p>Comments: <i>Staff presented the South 164<sup>th</sup> Street project for consideration as the 2011 Annual Neighborhood Sidewalk Project. The project would extend sidewalk on both sides of South 164<sup>th</sup> Street from 34<sup>th</sup> Avenue South to Military Road. During the 2011-2016 TIP process, the Planning Commission noted that sewer was not available on this portion of South 164<sup>th</sup> Street. Staff coordinated with Valley View Sewer District on the possibility of constructing sewer in conjunction with the sidewalk project. Valley View petitioned the neighborhood and will be forming a ULID to fund the sewer extension. Combining the projects will reduce the overall construction cost, and reduce disruption to the neighborhood. The South 164<sup>th</sup> Street project was highly ranked by the Sidewalk Ad Hoc Committee. The design would start in 2011 and construction would start in 2012.</i></p>
