Call to Order	Committee Chair Peter Kwon called the meeting to order at 5:00PM.
Presentation by Holly Williams, KPG	Role of Ad Hoc Committee as to help KPG determine a look and feel for these corridors and the district as a whole.
3. Vision Report by Jennifer Kester	Overview of the City Center Phase 1 Vision Report presented. Comments and discussion regarding the following occurred: South side of 176 th there is 0 space for retail/restaurants. No parking, on a steep incline. Feels that 176 th is the wrong spot for this (retail, etc.) While this is true given the <i>current</i> state of the roadway, there will likely be narrowing the roadway in order to provide capacity for these new businesses. The North side might be more viable to be <i>physically redeveloped</i> . This can also be through food trucks, food carts, etc.
Questions and Feeback	The following elements were discussed: • The business community has been looking forward to these improvements, appreciates the aesthetic that was presented.

	It is reported at the Hyatt Hotel, employees currently tell their guests not to walk up to 32nd because of crime/lighting/etc. Fitness trail for the hotel is suggested.
	 Corridors should be uniform end to end to provide continuity. Discussion regarding how the AHC will select the elements. AHC will develop a vision for these improvements and future improvements. Opportunity to choose specific items, but also to create a vision for entire district, continuity, etc. KPG is open to ideas. An idea was submitted regarding a project in Korea that uses large, functioning umbrellas on the street to provide shade and shelter, could be useful in this space. Discussion around the importance of CPTED principles to be incorporated within the design. Discussion arounf the importance of art as an opportunity to liven up the place and provide an opportunity for people to come and use the space, create community. Art has a nature and way of making people own the space, allow activities and eyes on the streets which in turn can help reduce crime. Accessibility for all user types is important – visual, physical, and hearing impaired. Consolidation of urban design elements onto poles (i.e wayfinding, lighting, art, banners). Suggestion was made for Aviation or space, to emphasize futuristic/innovative aspect of SeaTac. Discussion around this theme and if it is a airport/space theme or is it trees, mountains, nature.
