## DETERMINATION OF NONSIGNIFICANCE FILE SEP21-0009; CPA21-0001

**DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSAL:** Biennial update of the City of SeaTac Comprehensive Plan and concurrent changes to the SeaTac Zoning Map.

Amendment Proposals for Comprehensive Plan Map and Zoning Map: CITY INITIATED PROPOSALS:

- M-1) Establishing a "Park" Land Use Designation and Zone on Unused SR509 Right-of-Way Adjacent to Des Moines Creek Park: Establish a "Park" land use designation and zone on eight acres of surplus WSDOT right-of-way adjacent to Des Moines Creek Park recently purchased by the City for park uses.
- M-2) Updating Informational Map Amendments: Updates to data on Map 9.1 Wetlands and Streams. Text Amendments to Ch. 8 Economic Vitality Element and Ch. 5 Capital Facilities Background Report:

CITY INITIATED PROPOSALS:

- T-1) Adding Economic Development Policies Related to Tourism: Add one or more economic development policies related to tourism to the Chapter 8 Economic Vitality Element.
- T-2) Update of Capital Facilities Plan. Biennial update of the Capital Facilities Background Report, including the 6-year Capital Facilities Plan.

**PROPONENT:** City of SeaTac

**LOCATION:** Map Amendment M-1, the only site-specific proposal, is a portion of undeveloped right-of-way, considered to be surplus WSDOT inventory. The property abuts S 200<sup>th</sup> Street to the south and abuts Des Moines Creek Park. All proposed Text Amendments to the Comprehensive Plan apply city-wide.

**LEAD AGENCY:** City of SeaTac. The lead agency for this proposal has determined that it does not have a probable significant adverse impact on the environment, and an environmental impact statement (EIS) is not required under RCW 43.21C.030(2)(c). This decision was made after review of a completed Environmental Checklist and other information on file with the lead agency.

**COMMENT PERIOD:** This DNS is issued under WAC 197-11-340(2); the lead agency will not act on this proposal for 14 days from the date of issuance. **APPEAL PERIOD:** Any person wishing to appeal this determination may file such an appeal to the SeaTac City Clerk within ten (10) days from the end of the comment period.
