To be eligible for consideration, four (4) hard copies of a vendor's response to this Request for Proposals (hereafter called "response" or "proposals") must be received at the City of SeaTac, 3rd floor reception desk located at 4800 South 188th Street, SeaTac, WA 98188-8605 no later than **4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, February 15, 2022.** The response must be submitted in a sealed envelope with the vendor's name and due date clearly identified on the outside. Envelopes should be clearly marked in the lower left-hand corner "RFP Design for Fishing Pier and Boat Ramp Replacement at Angle Lake Park." NO FAXED OR EMAIL PROPOSALS WILL BE ACCEPTED.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Incorporated in February 1990, the City of SeaTac is located in the Pacific Northwest, approximately midway between the cities of Seattle and Tacoma in the State of Washington. The City has a population of 29,890 with a dramatic daily increase to 171,380 through employment, airport users and hotel guests. SeaTac is a vibrant community, economically strong, environmentally sensitive, and people oriented. The City boundaries surround the Seattle-Tacoma International Airport, approximately 3 square miles in area.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT

The proposed project will focus on redesigning and replacing the existing 2,180 square foot fishing pier for ADA compliance, replacing timber pilings, and upgrading the pier surface. The pier accommodates both fishing and swimming activities. Design should reflect separate areas for both activities to occur concurrently and safely.

The boat ramp replacement consists of removal and disposal of the existing concrete ties, correcting subgrade below the ordinary high-water level (OHWL) and installing new precast concrete panels (or similar) below OHWL. The project requires design development, engineering, permitting, cost estimating and construction administration for all improvements. Attending community meetings to present pier and boat ramp design as well as conducting weekly construction meetings throughout duration of project is required.

Design Fee: \$275,000

PROJECT BACKGROUND

Located in the southeast portion of the City at 19408 International Boulevard, Angle Lake Park is located on the 80-acre freshwater lake and consists of approximately 9 acres of public park space with picnic shelters, restrooms, performance stages, children's playground equipment, barbeque pads, a spray park and 370 feet of waterfront access for swimming and fishing.

Despite replacing the gangways and a few of the timber pilings replaced with steel; the pier and boat ramp were constructed over 60 years ago and need replacement to improve access, safety, and function for the public. The subgrade of the existing boat ramp beneath the OHWL has deteriorated causing hazardous conditions resulting in possible damage to boat trailers while launching/retrieving watercraft.

REQUIREMENTS

The architectural/engineering firm (A&E) must possess at least ten years demonstrated experience in successful projects of similar size and type. The A&E team must possess the engineering expertise essential to complete the project and perform the full range of services required for this scope of work. The construction documents must contain all the information needed to obtain all associated permits including but not limited to structural engineering, SEPA, JARPA, Hydraulic Project Approval (HPA) and building permit to bid and build the designed pier and boat ramp to its completion.

Submit your proposal letter describing your firm's experience working with public entities, especially municipal government and your experience and success working on similar projects. Also, submit a list of five of your firm's most successful projects of this nature completed. Provide drawings and/or photographs. Provide completion dates or current phase, reference name and contact number. Describe the outstanding features and element of each one.

SCOPE OF SERVICES AND DELIVERABLES

- 1. Design Development Prepare preliminary drawings defining the improvements as listed above. Prepare preliminary estimate of construction cost.
- 2. Construction Documentation Prepare construction drawings, technical specifications, and final cost estimate.
- 3. Prepare applications and assist with technical information for all necessary permits.
- 4. Conduct one or two City-wide community meetings and presentations to Parks and Recreation Committee to report progress of the project.
- 5. Construction Contract Administration Conduct construction meetings and perform site visits as needed to monitor progress and ensure quality of finished work.

ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR SUBMITTAL

In addition to any specific requirements requested in this proposal, the following documents must be completed and submitted with the proposal:

- Project Team (Key Staff): Identify the Project Manager and key project team members and their responsibilities. Also include their current workload regarding projects they are currently managing.
- 2. References: Provide the name and contact information for at least three (3) references familiar with the quality of work by your firm or similar nature as contained in the scope of work.

- 3. Project Understanding: Provide your general understanding regarding the Scope of Work and identify any potential challenges or special concerns that might be encountered.
- 4. Other Supporting Data: Include any other information you feel relevant to the selection of your firm or the makeup of the project team including sub-consultants.

The entire proposal shall not exceed twenty (20) pages, excluding the front and back covers, dividers, cover sheet, table of contents and letter of introductions (maximum of two pages).

EVALUATION CRITERIA

The architectural/engineering firm (A&E) selected for the project will be based on relevant experience and samples of similar work completed or in progress. A conceptual design is not required as part of the RFP. However, firms should provide enough information through photos or sketches of similar projects to adequately demonstrate initial design ideas. Proposals will also be evaluated and selected for interview based on the following criteria:

1.	Firms history and/or experience	25 points
2.	Samples of similar work	25 points
3.	Creativity/functionality of design	15 points
4.	Written presentation	10 points

GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The following terms and conditions apply to all proposals to provide services to City of SeaTac:

- 1. City of SeaTac expressly reserves the following rights:
 - a. To reject any and/or all irregularities in the proposals submitted.
 - b. To reject any or all proposals or portions thereof.
 - c. To base awards with due regard to quality of services, experience, compliance with specifications, and other such factors as may be necessary in the circumstances.
 - d. To make the award to any vendor or combination of vendors whose proposal(s), in the opinion of the City, is in the best interest of the City.
 - e. To award the contract to the next most qualified Consultant if the selected Consultant does not execute a contract within thirty (30) days after the award of the proposal.
- 2. All proposals must be sealed in an envelope or appropriate packaging and addressed as requested in the RFP. Envelopes should be clearly marked in the lower left hand corner "RFP Design for Fishing Pier and Boat Ramp Replacement at Angle Lake Park."
- 3. The RFP must be signed with ink by an authorized individual of the company empowered to act in that capacity before a contract will be negotiated.
- 4. Any proposal or modification received after the hour and date specified will be returned unopened.
- 5. All documents, reports, proposals, submittals, working papers, or other materials prepared by the consultant pursuant to this proposal shall become the sole and exclusive property of the City, and the public domain, and not the property of the consultant. The consultant shall not

copyright, or cause to be copyrighted, any portion of said items submitted to the City because of this solicitation.

- 6. All the items mentioned in paragraph 5 above submitted to City of SeaTac should be printed both sides on recycled paper whenever practicable.
- 7. Insurance The consultant shall procure and maintain insurance as outlined below for the duration of this Agreement. Any Commercial General Liability and Automobile Liability insurance policies obtained shall be underwritten by insurance companies which have an A.M. Best's rating of A VII or better, licensed to do business in the State of Washington. Liability insurance policies shall specifically name the City, its elected or appointed officials, officers, employees and volunteers as Primary-Non-Contributory Additional Insureds of said policies.

The consultant shall not begin work under the Agreement until all required insurance has been obtained and until such insurances have been received by the City. The consultant shall file with the City a certificate of insurance evidencing that the policies are in force. The certificate shall be accompanied by policy endorsements as are necessary to comply with these requirements.

The types and limits insurance are as follows:

\$1,000,000 per accident bodily injury and property damage liability, including any owned, hired or non-owned automobile.

WORKER'S COMPENSATION

Employees of Contractor and Subcontractors are to be insured under Washington State Industrial Insurance.

The General Aggregate provision of the Contractor's insurance policies shall be amended to show that the General Aggregate Limit of the policies applies separately to this contract.

Failure of the Contractor to fully comply with the requirements regarding insurance will be considered a material breach of contract and shall be cause for immediate termination of the contract.

8. Business License- The consultant shall procure and maintain a Business License with valid City of SeaTac endorsement required by City of SeaTac Municipal Code Title 5.
