- 3. Identifying, removing and disposing hazardous/biohazard waste

All contractors must be licensed, bonded and insured in the State of Washington. All abatement contractors must be properly certified and shall provide evidence of current certification upon application. All contractors must have a current City of SeaTac business license.

Background

The City of SeaTac conducts compliance actions on private properties with serious code violations constituting blight and/or a public nuisance. Such action is undertaken when all means to secure voluntary compliance from the property owner have failed. Required services include but are not limited to removal and disposal of all types of vehicles, junk, garbage, trash, and hazardous/bio-hazard materials. These materials must be removed and disposed of in accordance with State law. The City wants to create a Small Works Roster of contractors that can perform any and/or all these services on an on-call basis.
