African Community Housing & Development – Rental assistance update utilizing HB1406 funding	Bree Nicolello and Hamdi Abdulle, Executive Director from African Community Housing & Development gave an update on the rental assistance funding. Their primary focus is on families and elderly who are within two months of falling behind in rent, who reside in single family homes, Pine Ridge, Hunt Club, or Shannon South Apartments. They currently have a wait list of nearly 100 people in SeaTac who need to be served. They have served 31 households with \$75,000 of

Ce as: uti	ulti-Service enter – Rental sistance update ilizing HB1406 nding	Maju Qureshi, Economic Stability Director from Multi-Service Center gave an overall perspective of services they provide. The HB1406 funds have been used to assist referrals from City of SeaTac, Highline Public Schools, and Bow Lake Mobile Home Park. They have served five SeaTac residents and five additional applications are pending but didn't state the current expenditure of the budgeted funding. They still have funds remaining and plan to continue to accept referrals.
