Puget Sound Starts Here Campaign: The Puget Sound Starts Here spring 2011 campaign launched this week with television spots running over the next six weeks and a documentary which aired on KIRO 7 TV on March 24. This regional stormwater education campaign is designed to raise awareness that our local practices, such as washing cars, using fertilizers and scooping dog poop, affect the health of the Puget Sound.

This educational campaign is a product of STORM (Stormwater Outreach for Regional Municipalities) and its partners, the Washington Department of Ecology and the Puget Sound Partnership. STORM is composed of the City of SeaTac along with 59 other jurisdictions from across the Puget Sound dedicated to raising awareness on the impacts of stormwater pollution and how residents can do their part to help improve the health of our natural waterways and the Puget Sound.

The Puget Sound Starts Here television ads are partnered with other social marketing strategies, such as Twitter, Facebook, and individual blog sites, all designed to encourage positive

behavioral changes toward reducing the pollution in our stormwater systems. The television ads also point people toward the campaign website, www.pugetsoundstartshere.org, where further information is offered regarding problems facing the Puget Sound, along with workable solutions we can do in our everyday actions to reduce our pollution of the waters. The website offers scientific data, photos, videos, children activities, and more.
